Draft – Criteria Levels of Care in Supportive Housing

Medically Supported Housing:

- Resident has a medical condition requiring daily medical assistance in the form of specialized care and/or treatment (e.g., nursing, health technicians, durable medical equipment, etc.)
- Resident requires assistance with medication administration
- Resident requires assistance with ADLs
- Resident's cognitive function necessitates daily assistance
- Resident requires a secure setting due to elopement and wandering behaviors

Facility-Based Supportive Housing:

- Resident is able to safely and adequately self-administer medications with moderate supervision
- Resident has a medical co-occurring condition requiring support (e.g. diabetes, cancer, TB, etc.)
- Resident has a co-occurring condition such as lower cognitive functioning and cognitive decline that necessitates consistent support
- Resident requires support with ADLs
- Resident requires a setting that monitors for elopement and wandering behaviors
- Resident requires support with making and keeping supportive and medical services appointments

TBRA/PSH

- Resident is able to self-administer medications with minimal supervision
- Resident can perform ADLs independently
- Resident had the ability to maintain a household with minimal supervision
- Resident had the ability to maneuver in the community with minimal supervision
- Resident can make and keep supportive and medical services appointment with minimal supervision
