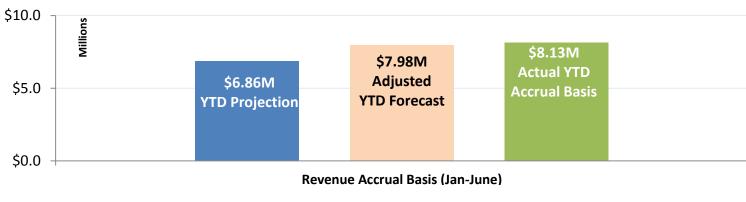

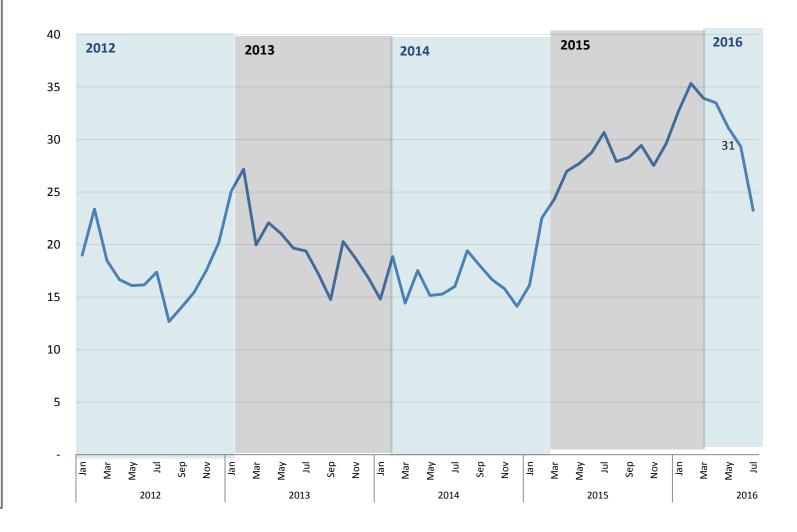

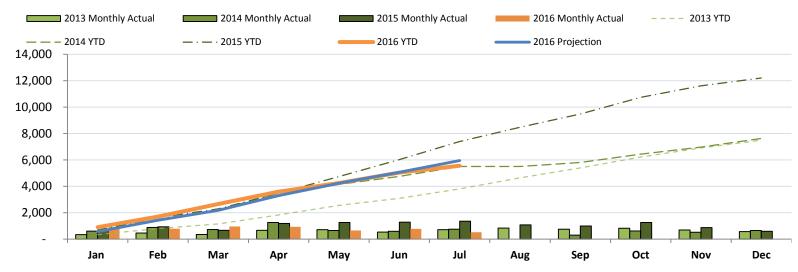

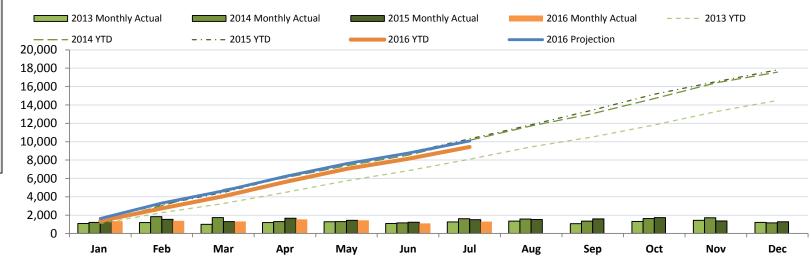

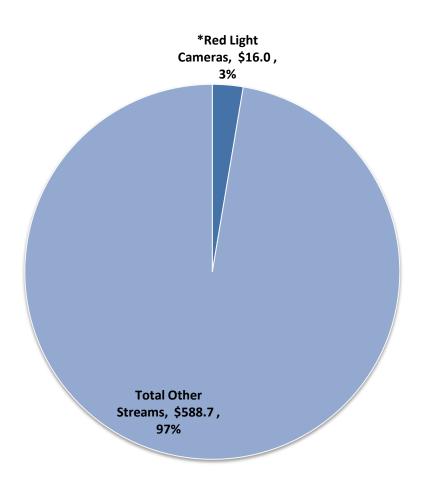

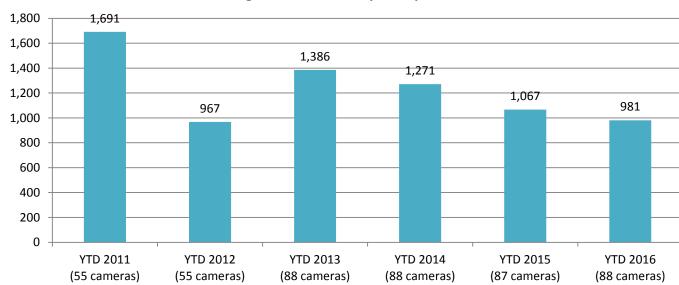

Average Number of Exceptions per Camera



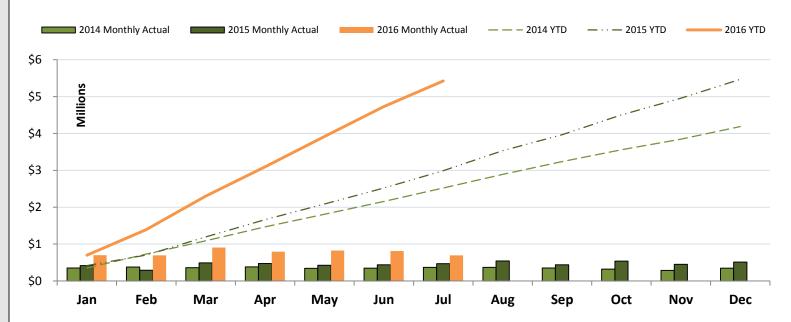

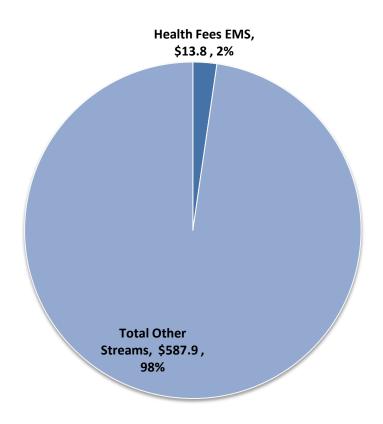

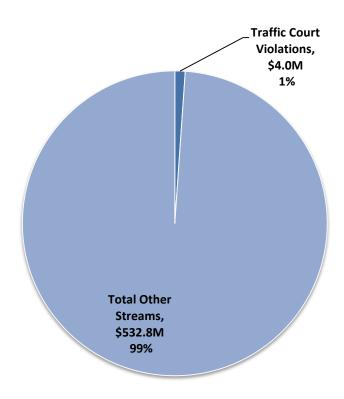

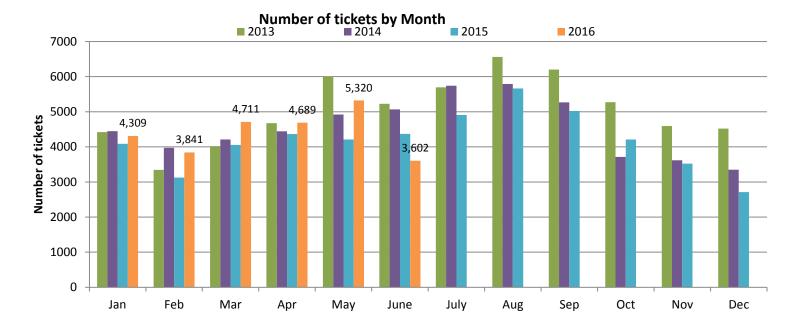
Traffic Court* 1% Adopted Budget GF Revenues for 2016

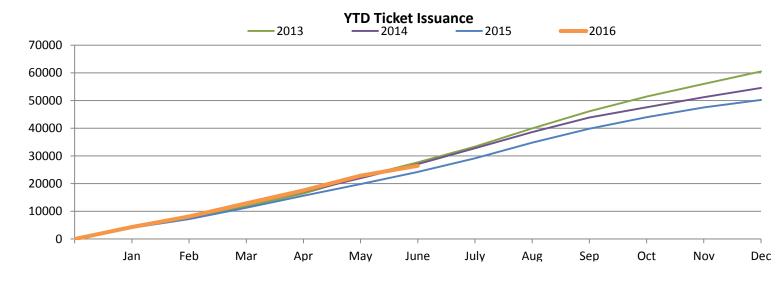

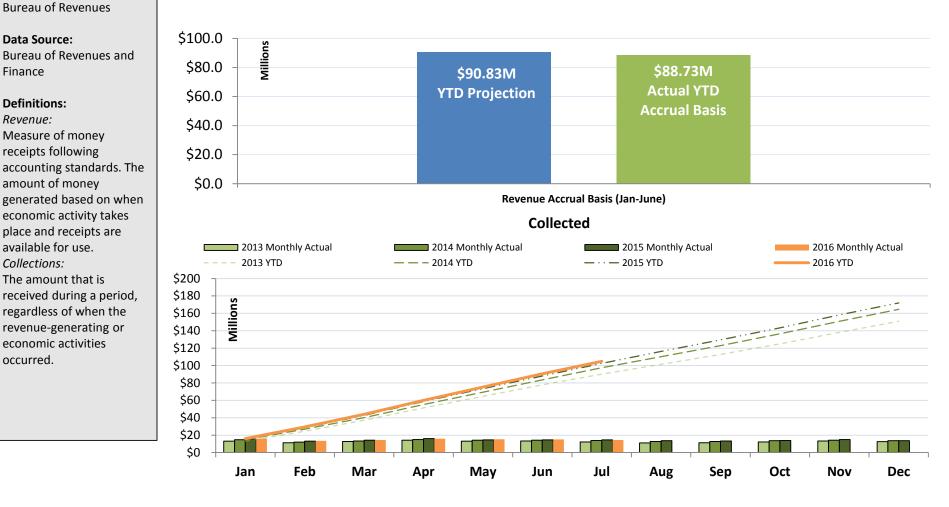

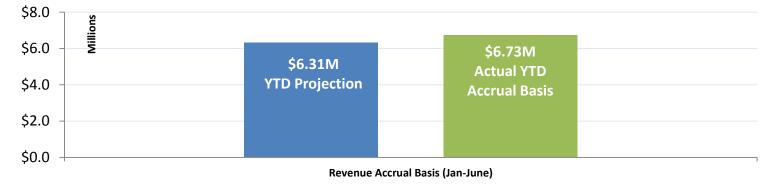

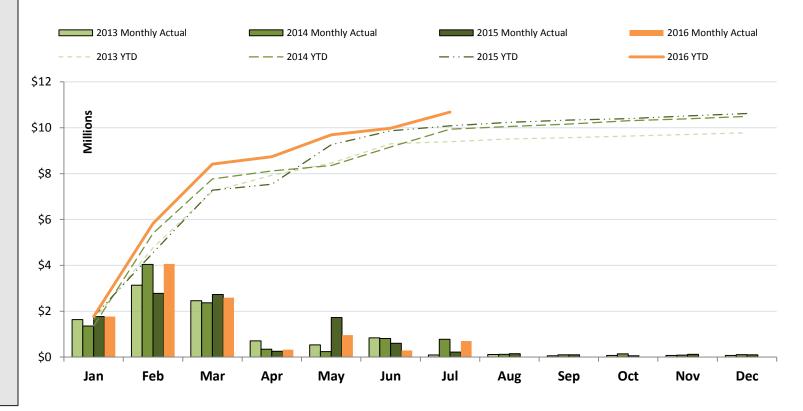

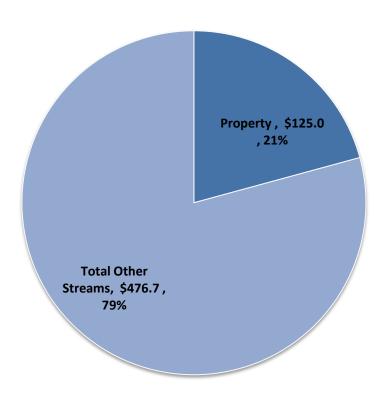

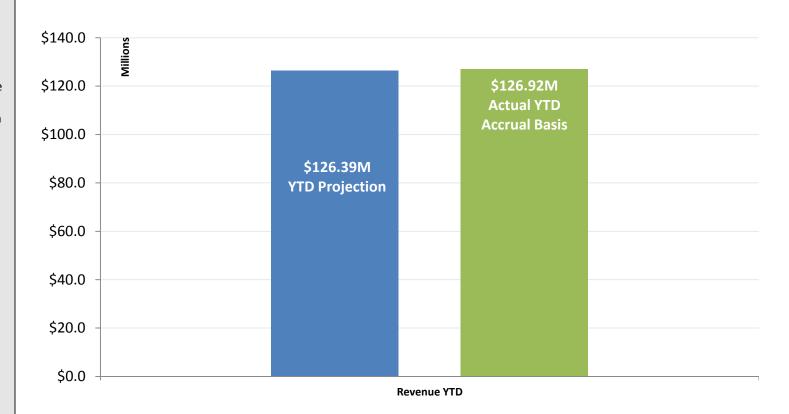

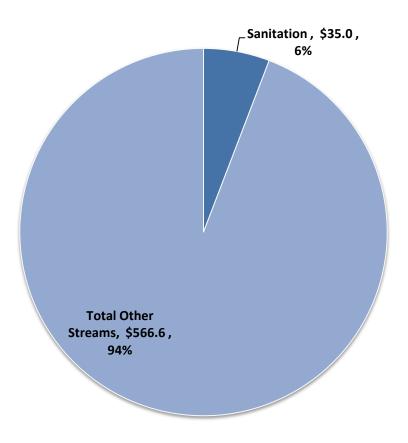

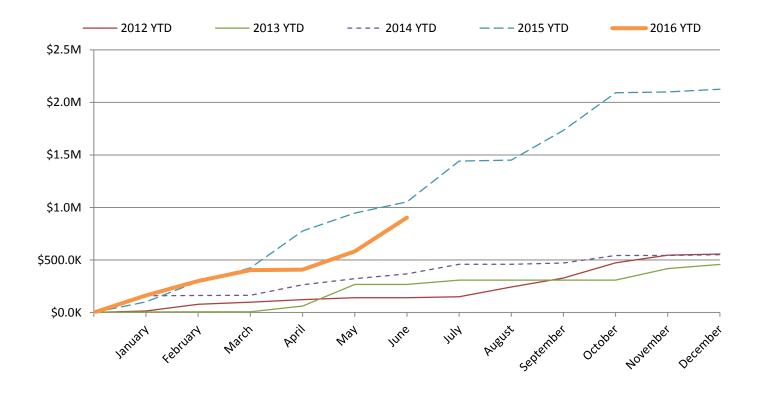

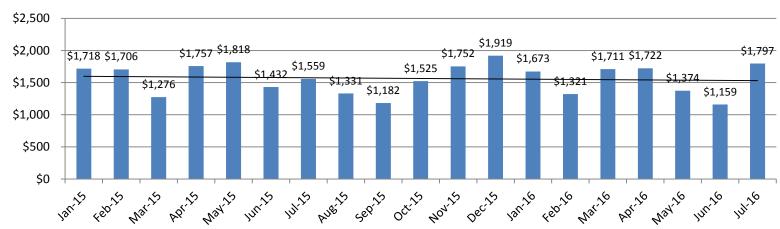

Average Claim Payment Trending Downward; Anticipated Cost per New Claim Trends Upward



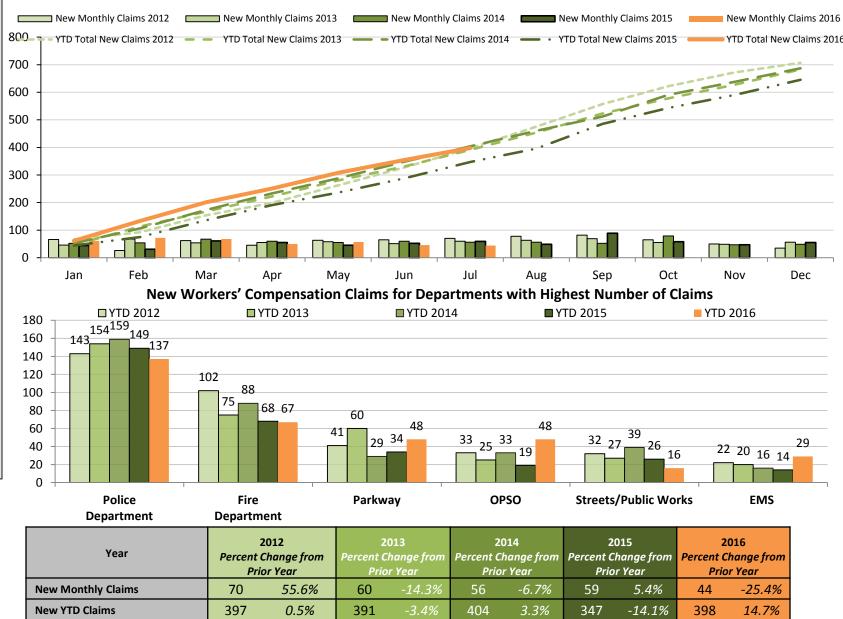


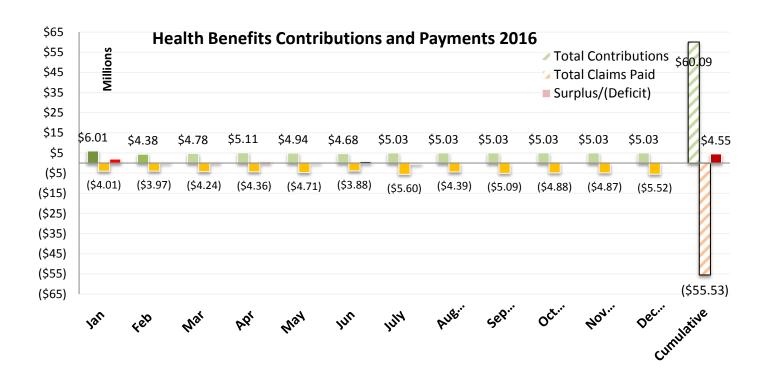
Anticipated Cost per New WC Claim

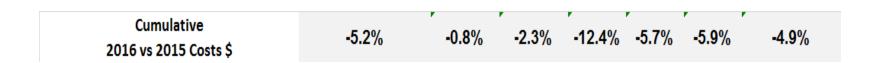

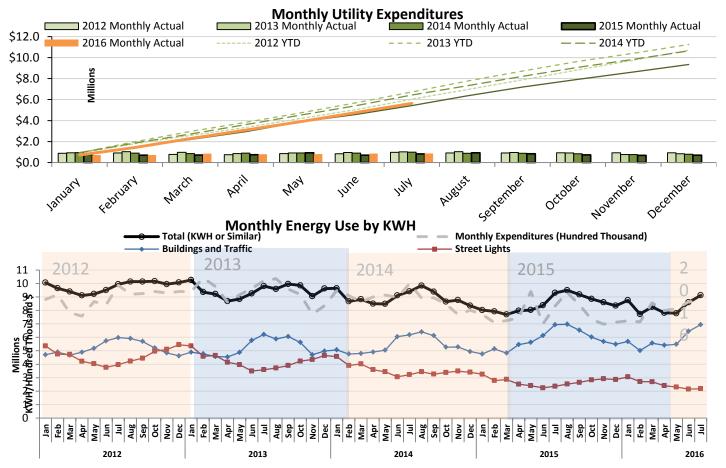
