PAPERBOARD AND CARDBOARD BOXES including snack & food boxes, 12-pack soft drink boxes, and corrugated cardboard (please flatten cardboard)

PLASTIC food and beverage containers (*coded #1 through #7*)

SMALL METAL CANS AND FOOD CONTAINERS including aluminum, steel, and tin

ITEMS FOR TRASH

GLASS

STYROFOAM

PLASTIC BAGS & FILM

BUBBLE WRAP

PIZZA BOXES

FOOD CONTAMINATED CONTAINERS

Recycling bins should be placed curbside no earlier than **7PM each Monday**, but before **4AM Tuesday** to ensure pick-up.

Residents must provide proof of ownership/residence at an **eligible** service location (Sewerage & Water Board Bill, Drivers License, Utility Bill, Rental Agreement).

Residents may also use an existing/purchased 18-gallon blue bin with an imprinted recycling logo.

By City Code - **Eligible** units are locations with four units or less (under one roof) and billed for **City Sanitation** on their monthly Sewerage & Water Board bills.

Units which produce more than thirty-five (35) gallons of solid waste each regular collection, complexes containing five or more units, and restaurants, bars and hotels are responsible for contracting with private solid waste contractors.
