AGREEMENT

NOW COME the parties – Appellant Christopher Seker and the Appointing Authority, Office of Information Technology and Innovation ("ITI") – who represent that an agreement has been reached to resolve the above-captioned Civil Service ("CS") appeal, in lieu of and prior to the evidentiary hearing scheduled for April 3, 2024, pursuant to CS Rule II, Section 6.7.

WHEREFORE, on June 7, 2022, ITI terminated the employment of Christopher Seker, who appealed the disciplinary action. The Civil Service Commission reinstated Mr. Seker to his position on January 23, 2023. Mr. Seker returned to work several weeks thereafter. Based on Civil Service Rule XI, 1.5(a), departments are to set performance goals for classified staff between October 1 – January 31 to evaluate the work performance of the following year (the "Performance Planning Session"). Mr. Seker's return to work occurred after this established session ended, and therefore, ITI was precluded from drafting performance goals.

WHEREFORE, this agreement serves the narrow purpose of allowing ITI to evaluate the fully-reinstated Appellant for 2023 and to restore his eligibility for merit pay, given the unique situation of his reinstatement and return to work after the Performance Planning Session ended. Therefore, ITI agrees to evaluate Mr. Seker for the performance year 2023 by April 1, 2024, and in consideration, the Appellant agrees to withdraw the appeal in this matter.

WHEREFORE, the parties – Appellant Christopher Seker and Office of Information Technology and Innovation (ITI) – request that this Agreement, reached prior to the scheduled Civil Service evidentiary hearing, be entered into the record and be presented to the New Orleans Civil Service Commission for acknowledgment at its next scheduled meeting.
