
Structure Inspections

Structure Inspections by Type Nov 29 – Dec 30 1006 total inspections







 The figures at right represent the time that has transpired from the first call to the date of the inspection (calls not inspected in over twenty days were received by code enforcement in early November at the latest)






- Hearings from Nov 29 Dec 10 were the first merged code enforcement and environmental health hearings

Total Combined Hearings







- All demolition recommendations are subject to HDLC and NCDC jurisdiction as applicable
