To My Fellow New Orleanians:

Since coming into office 2,005 days ago, I have spoken often of our hopes for New Orleans. We are working to become a safer city where every resident can get a good-paying job and where every child has access to an excellent public education. We are committed to reorganizing how government works so people can get the services they deserve; a city whose government is open and honest.

Over the past five years, we have taken enormous strides to get this city on the right path. In partnership with the City Council and based on important feedback from you, we have identified priority capital recovery projects in each council district, from community centers to pools to playgrounds to vital public safety infrastructure.

Since taking office, my administration has met with FEMA over 820 times, producing an additional \$946.7 million more in recovery assistance for the City and the Sewerage and Water Board to repair buildings and critical infrastructure like water pipes and streets. This year's Capital Budget reflects committed funding for those projects.

In this 2016 Capital Budget of over \$484 million, every dollar will be affiliated with a project or program. The budget proposes the issuance of \$50 million in General Obligation Bonds in 2016 to help fix our streets—one of your top priorities. These new bond funds will complement the over \$70 million in road repairs as part of the FEMA-funded Recovery Roads Program, and \$41 million for street and stormwater management projects as proposed in our Resilience Strategy.

In 2016, we are budgeted to move forward on dozens of public facilities like construction of a new terminal facility at Louis Armstrong Airport and replacement of the bridge at Joe Brown Park. This is on top of our already large number of on-going improvement projects like the Criminal Evidence and Processing Center, Milne Gym Renovation in Gentilly, Municipal Yacht Harbor in West End, the reconstruction of St. Bernard Ave. from Filmore Ave. to Robert E. Lee Blvd., and Gert Town Natatorium and NOPD Second District Police Station in Gert Town.

We are on the right track. With our continued progress, New Orleans is developing into a city of opportunity, with safe neighborhoods, quality schools for all of our children and good-paying jobs here at home.

This 2016 Capital Budget helps us to stay the course we charted five years ago and continue our progress towards becoming a world-class city.
