


Joseph St. One-Way Traffic Trial Magazine St. to Camp St.



On Friday, June 15, 2012, at approximately 9:00 a.m., the segment of Joseph St. between Magazine St. and Camp St. in Uptown New Orleans will be converted from its current two-way directional status to oneway operation in the lakebound direction (from Magazine St. toward Camp St.). This trial modification will be enacted to alleviate residents' concerns about the width of the street and its ability to handle twoway traffic and parking, safely. This conversion is being done on a six month trial basis, during which time the City of New Orleans' Department of Public Works will monitor the effects of the change before a final determination is made.

In response to requests made by residents to alleviate traffic congestion in this busy corridor of Magazine Street, and after a formal review by the Department of Public Works, it was determined that the roadway may be too narrow for two-way traffic and parking on both sides of the street.



A survey was mailed to nearby residents asking for feedback on the proposed traffic change. 100 percent of the returned surveys were in favor of the change to one-way traffic. In order to improve traffic flow in this neighborhood, the Department of Public Works will now post signs designating this segment of road as one-way.

The portion of Joseph St., from Constance St. to Magazine St. is already one-way. This trial change extends the one-way traffic through to Camp St.
