Simple Ways to Improve Quality of Life in New Orleans

Per [City of New Orleans Ordinances](http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/ordinances/) overseeing sanitation issues (<http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/ordinances/>), citizens can and should improve daily quality of life in New Orleans for themselves and their fellow citizens by observing the following

1. Do not litter (Section 138)
2. Do not place signs illegally on public rights of way, including neutral grounds or the area between the sidewalk and the curb. (Section 134)
3. Properly contain solid waste for collection and remove empty carts from curbs. (Section 138)
4. Call 311 to schedule pick-up of [bulky waste](http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/trash/bulky-waste/) (<http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/trash/bulky-waste/>), such as appliances, furniture, carpet, more than 6 bundles of tree branches cut in less than 4-foot lengths, and up to 4 tires. Business are not eligible for bulky waste collection; view [Business Sanitation](http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/businesses/) (<http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/businesses/>) for more information and options. (Section 138)
5. Per City code, arrange private removal and disposal for rebuilding, renovating, or clearing property. (Section 138)
6. Ensure all permanent dumpsters are screened from public view. (Section 26-447)
7. Cut grass and remove litter, grass cuttings, and leaves from properties, extending 1.5 feet from the curb.
8. Do not sweep, blow, or pour items into storm drains, which drain into Lake Ponchartrain. (Sections 66-287, 313, 314)
9. Do not keep more than 20 tires on residential property, unless specifically permitted to do so. (Chapter 105, State Regulatory Code)
10. If hauling garbage, trash or other loose items in vehicles, securely cover the contents. (Section 138-105)
11. Do not place Household Hazardous Waste in regular garbage or drain systems. (Section 138)
12. Reduce, Reuse, Educate and [Recycle](http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/recycling/) (<http://new.nola.gov/sanitation/recycling/>).

FACT SHEET**

The mission of the Department of Sanitation is to provide collection, disposal and recycling of solid waste and the cleaning of streets in a manner that is safe, efficient, environmentally sound and cost effective; to enforce State, Federal and local laws and regulations in relation to applicable violations and to educate the public on ways to improve the quality-of-life in our community.

Office hours are 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Monday – Friday

Call 311 -To report complaints, start garbage/recycling service, or schedule a bulky waste pick up

Collection schedule outside of the FQ/DDD: Garbage-twice weekly/Recycling-once weekly. On regular collection days, carts and properly contained debris must be curbside prior to 5:00 a.m. Once emptied, carts are not to remain adjacent to the curb, but must be stored so as not to interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

HOW TO SEPARATE DEBRIS CURBSIDE AFTER A DECLARED EMERGENCY

DEBRIS TYPE	EXAMPLES
Regular Garbage	Food, trash
Vegetative	Tree Limbs, leaves,
White Goods	Refrigerators, washers, dryers
Construction Debris (C&D)	Sheetrock, carpeting, wood, furniture
Household Hazardous Waste	Paint, chemicals, oils, flammable substances, e-waste (televisions, computers)

EMERGENCY DEBRIS REMOVAL PHASES

PHASE	REMOVAL DESCRIPTION
70 Hour Push	Push large objects blocking major, priority roadways to the roadsides to allow for passage of emergency and essential personnel vehicles; removal of hanging limbs and leaning trees which pose hazards to major, priority roadways; removal of trees on houses
First Pass	Continuation of clearing on all roadways, tree trimming and removals, hauling of large, event related debris such as: woodwaste, appliances, and household hazardous waste placed curbside or in the public rights-of way
Second Pass	Continuation of clearing on all roadways, tree trimming and removals, hauling of all event related debris placed curbside or in the public rights-of-way
Third and Final Pass	Continuation of road clearing on all roadways, tree trimming and removals, hauling of all event related debris placed curbside or in the public rights-of-way


