I. Summary of Position

The Public Health Nurse will be responsible for overseeing referral coordination for residents presenting to the City of New Orleans with complex care needs. This position will also support public health clinical emergency planning and infectious disease outbreak response through participation in Emergency Support Function-8 (public health and medical) planning committees and supporting department immunization initiatives.

III. Duties and Responsibilities

A. Core Functions (provide at least 3):

- Oversee the clinical needs assessment and healthcare system navigation for complex medical cases of both unhoused and housed individuals within the City's multi-disciplinary Complex Needs team framework.
- Support NOHD with emergency plan development for individuals with medical needs.
- Support NOHD immunization event planning, operations, and outreach.

B. Additional Responsibilities (if applicable):

- Support NOHD's street medicine team to facilitate regular health events and basic clinical evaluation.
- Work with the Office of Homeless Services and Strategy's outreach team to evaluate unhoused individuals in the field for appropriate short-term housing referrals and placements.

C. Physical Requirements, if any:

• Will need to be able to work both indoors and outdoors in various conditions.

May have to lift up to 50 lbs.

- Conduct field-based assessments to identify complex care needs of individuals living in conditions that are not meeting their current health needs.
- Lead referral and follow-up efforts (through provider case conferences, patient follow-up, etc) of these individuals to services available in the New Orleans area.
- Support annual planning efforts to coordinate healthcare providers to strengthen vaccine-preventable disease immunity across New Orleans residents and visitors.
- Support emergency response efforts within the department as an essential staff member and member of the department's planning team.
