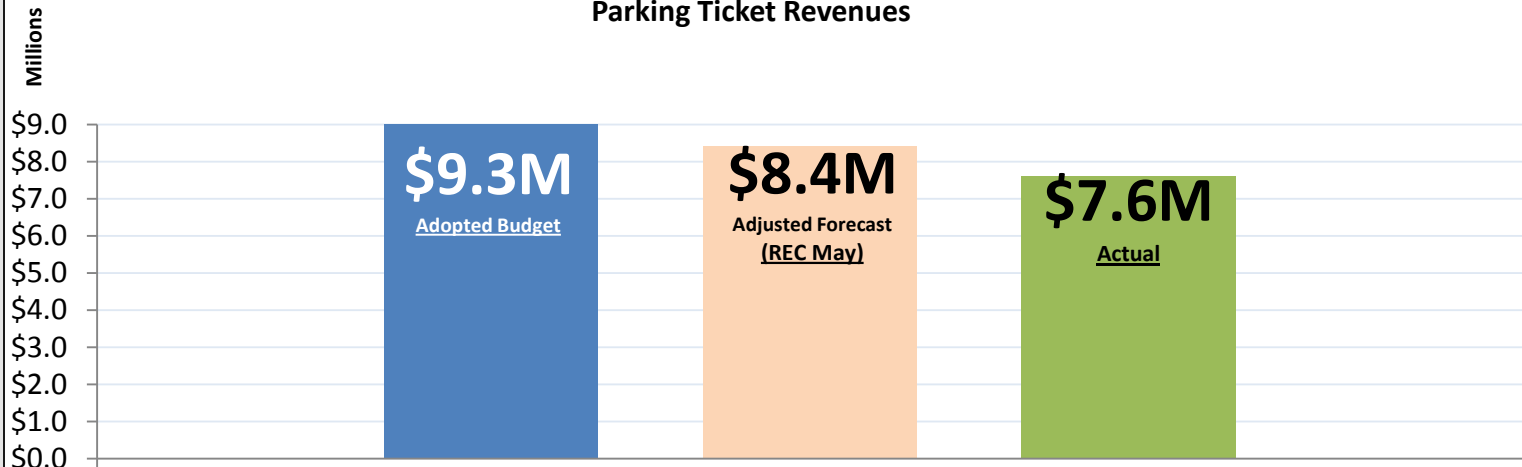

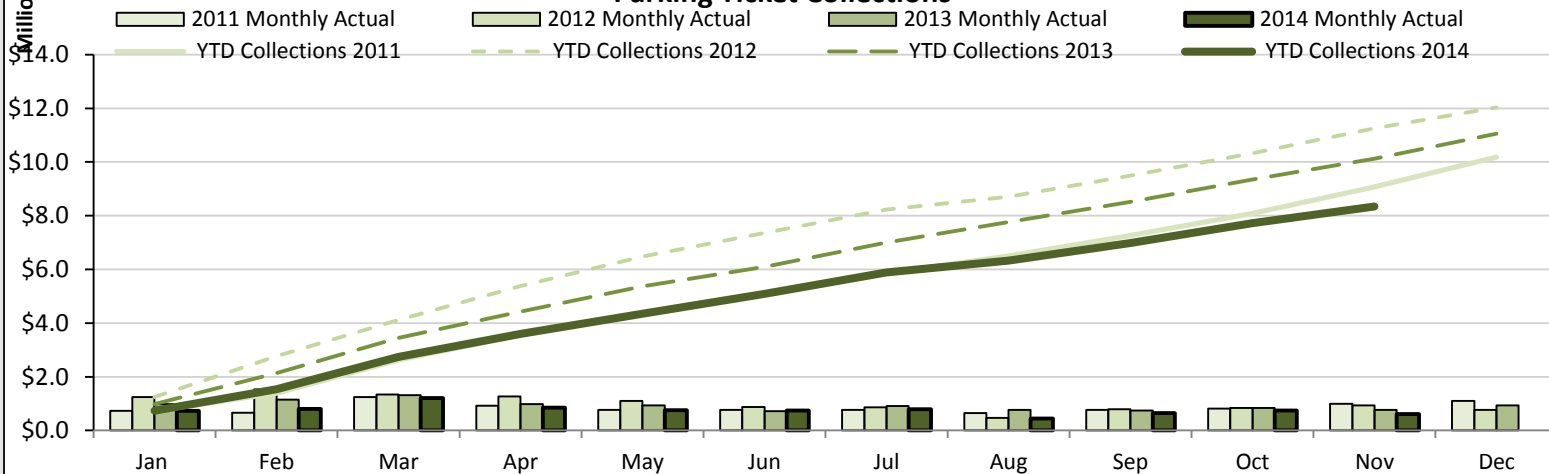

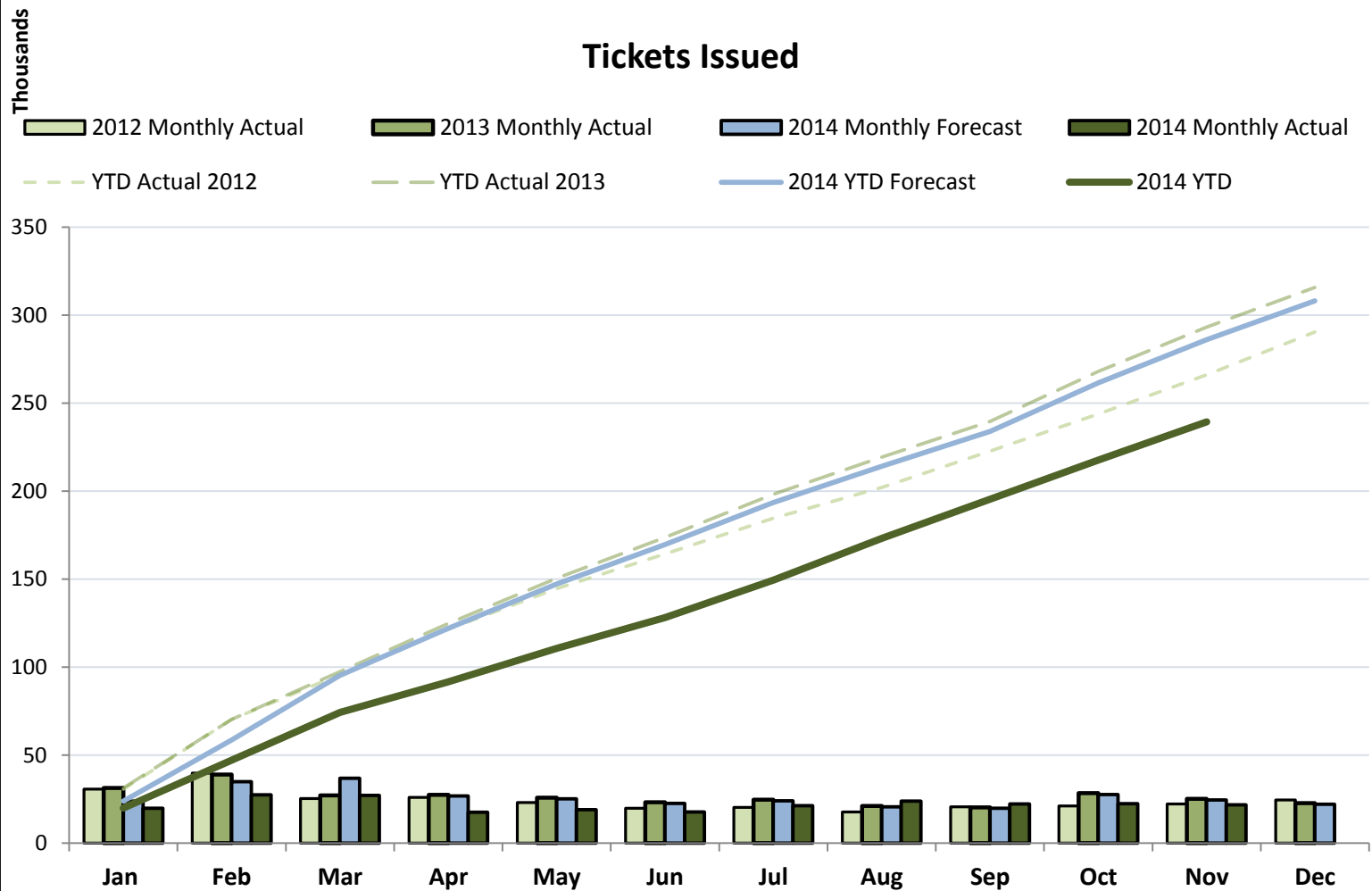

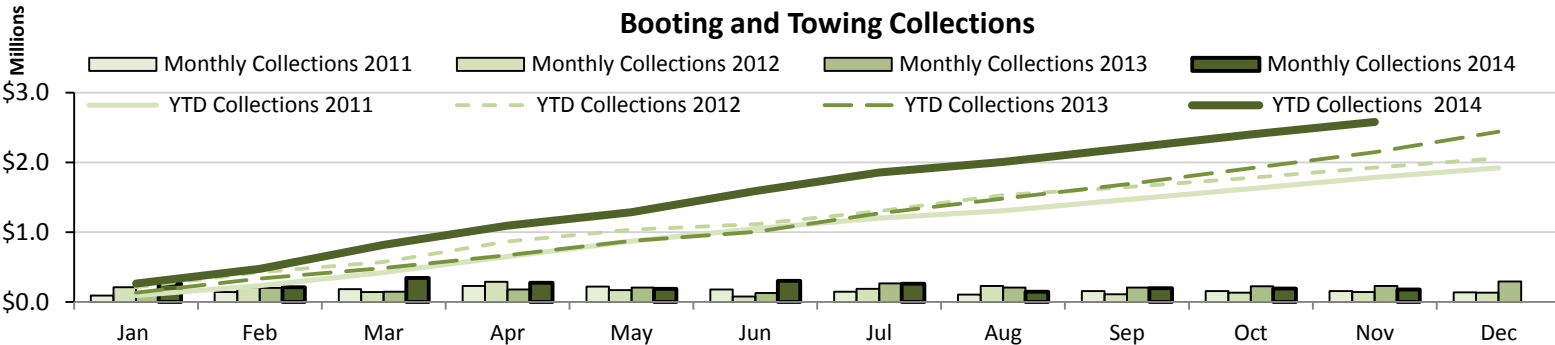

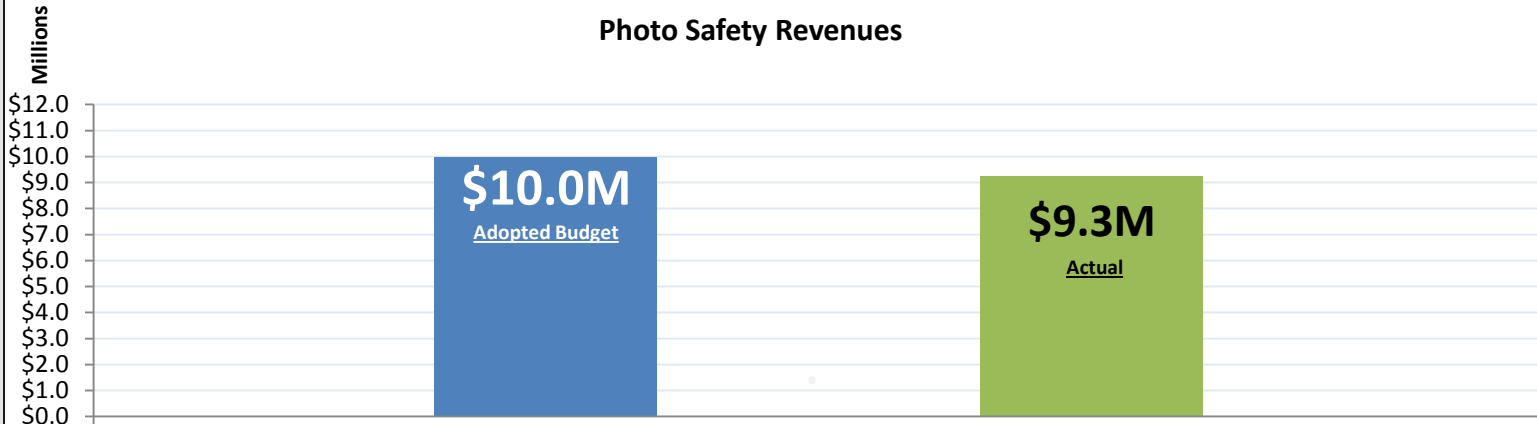

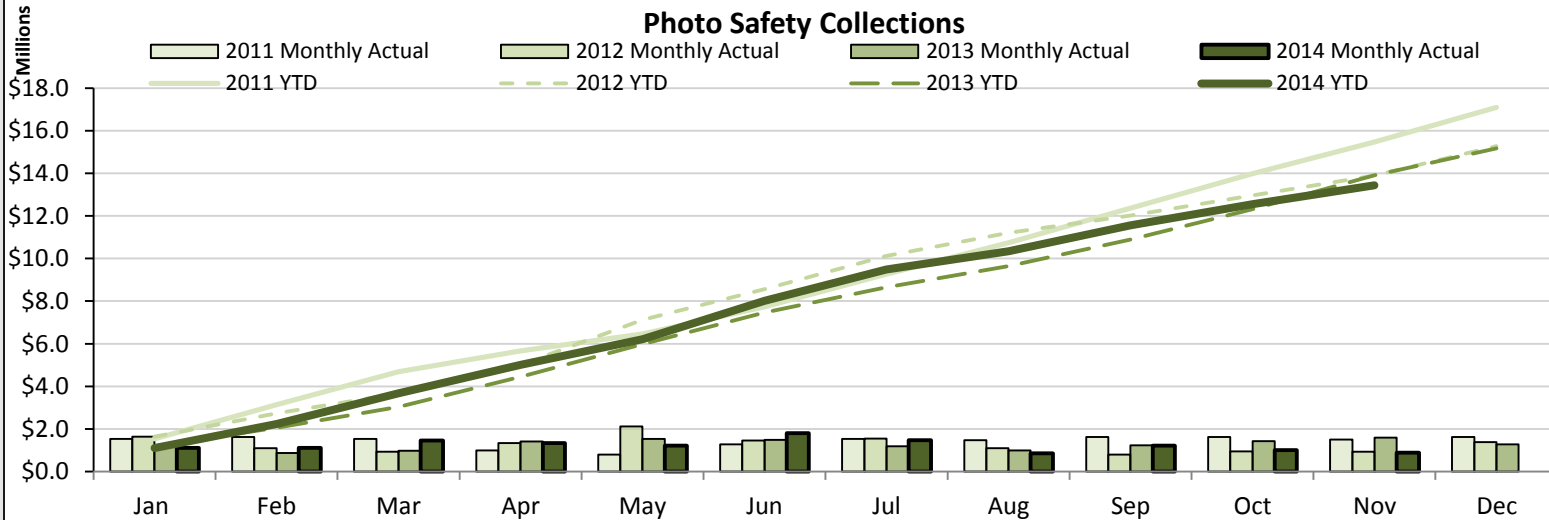

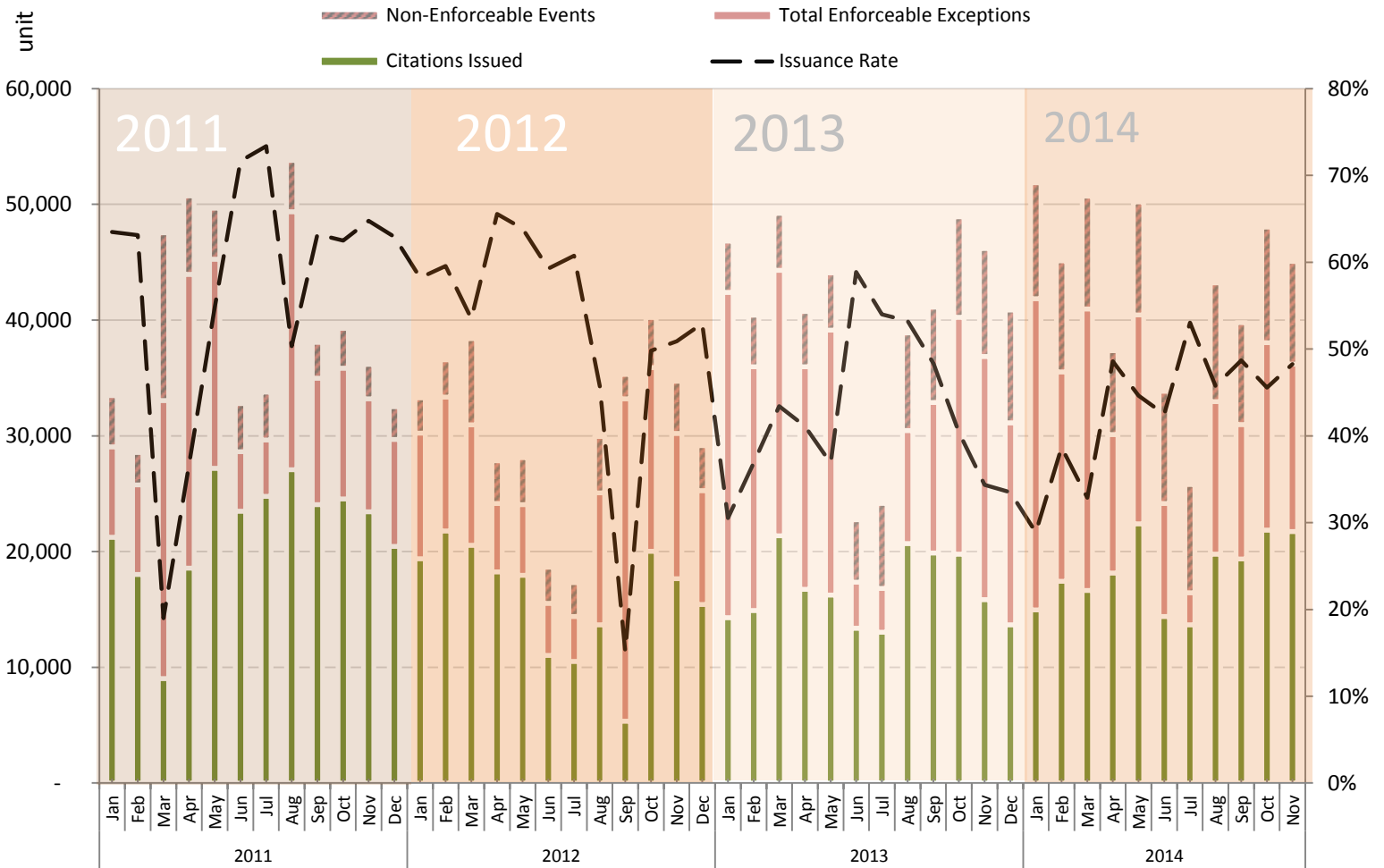

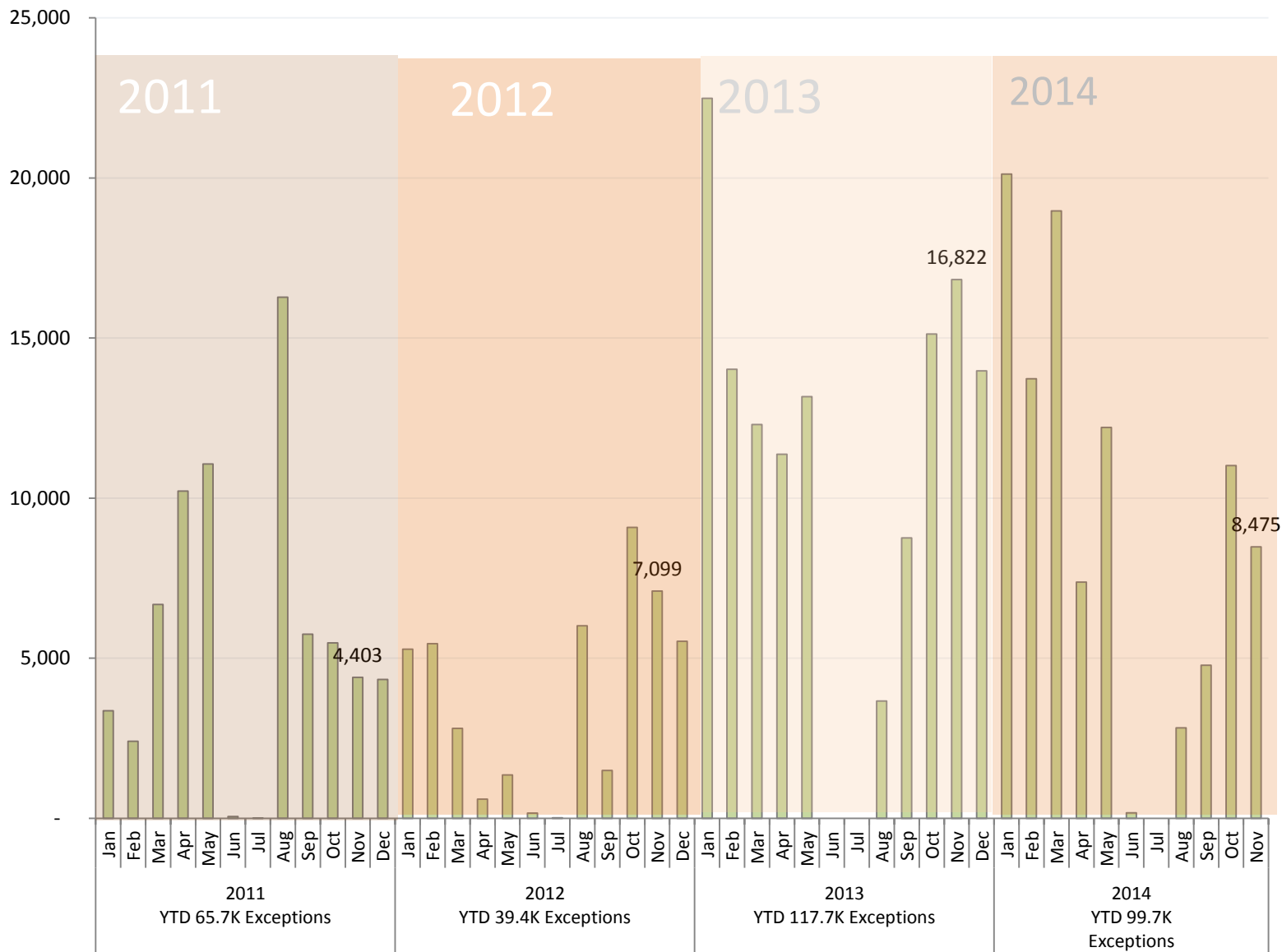

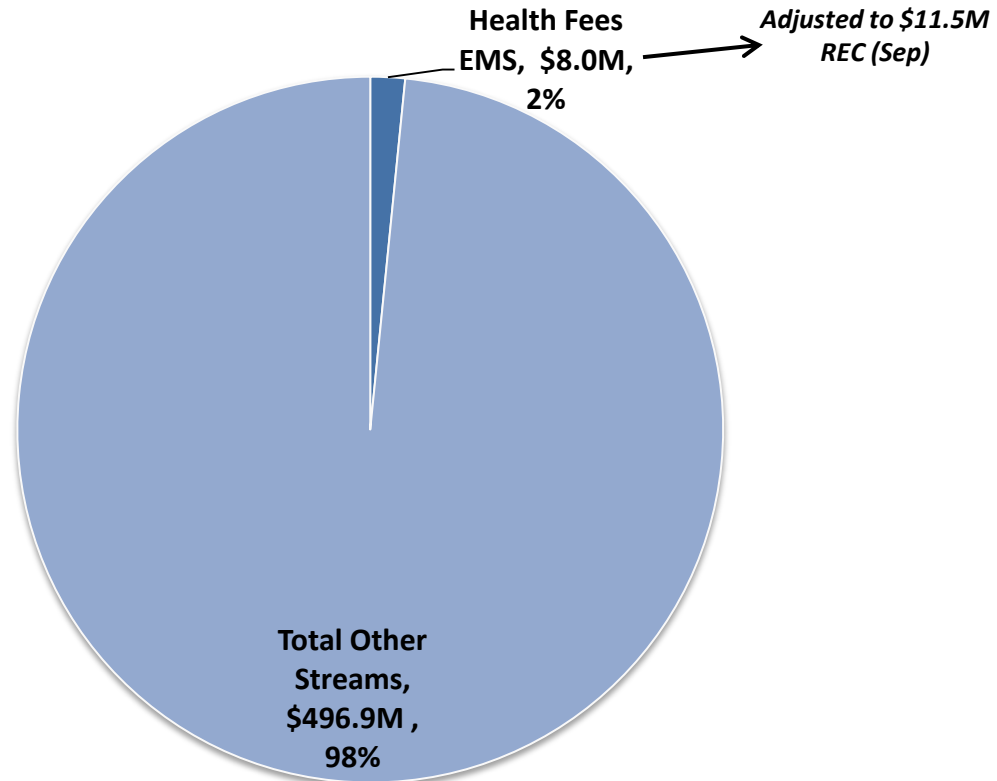

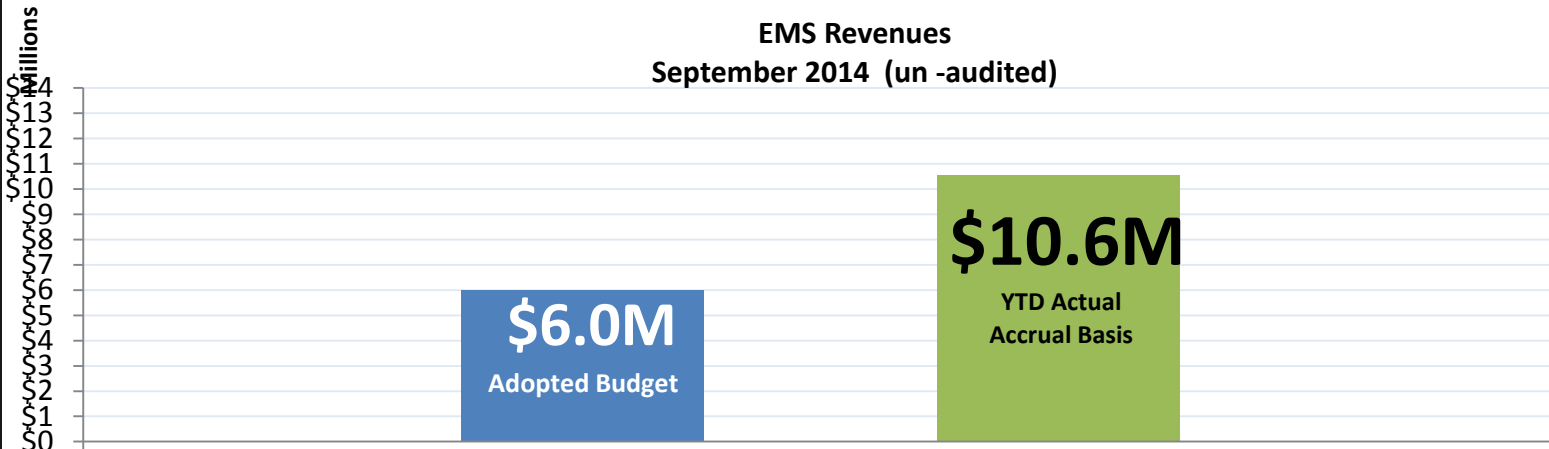

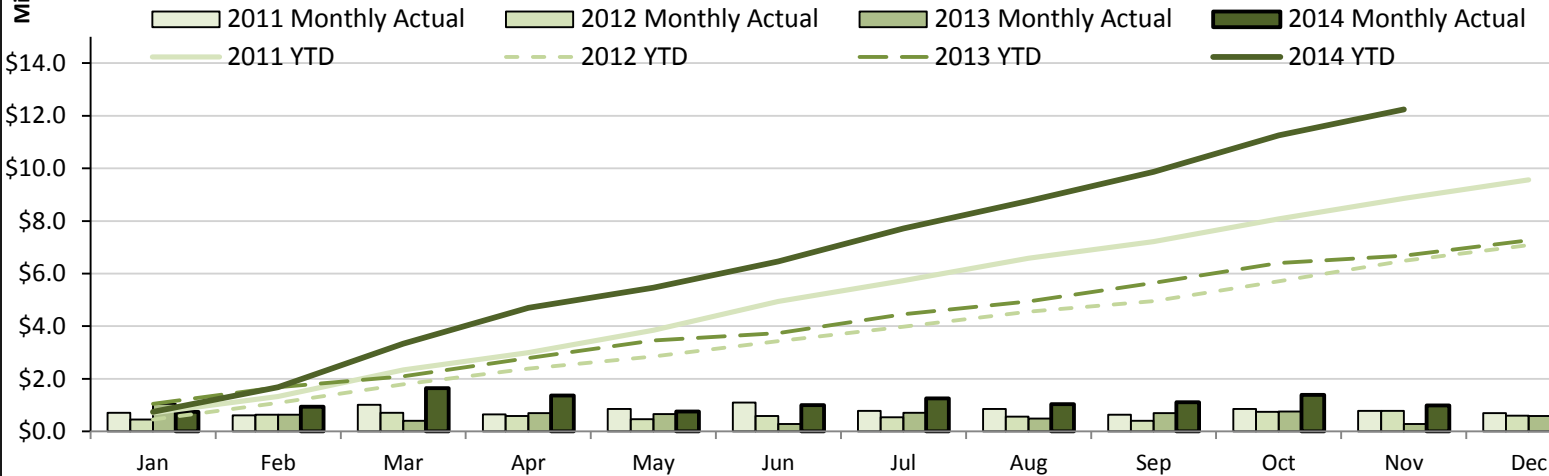

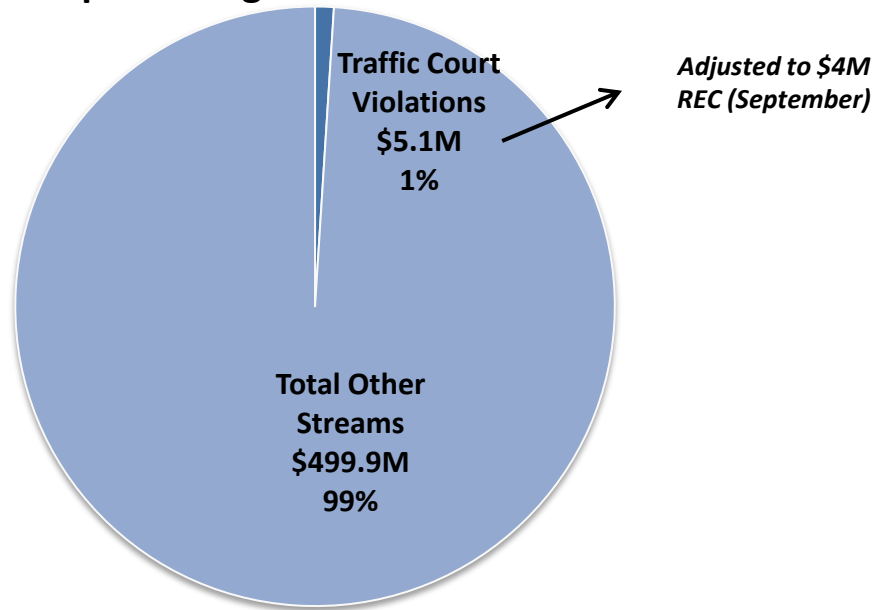

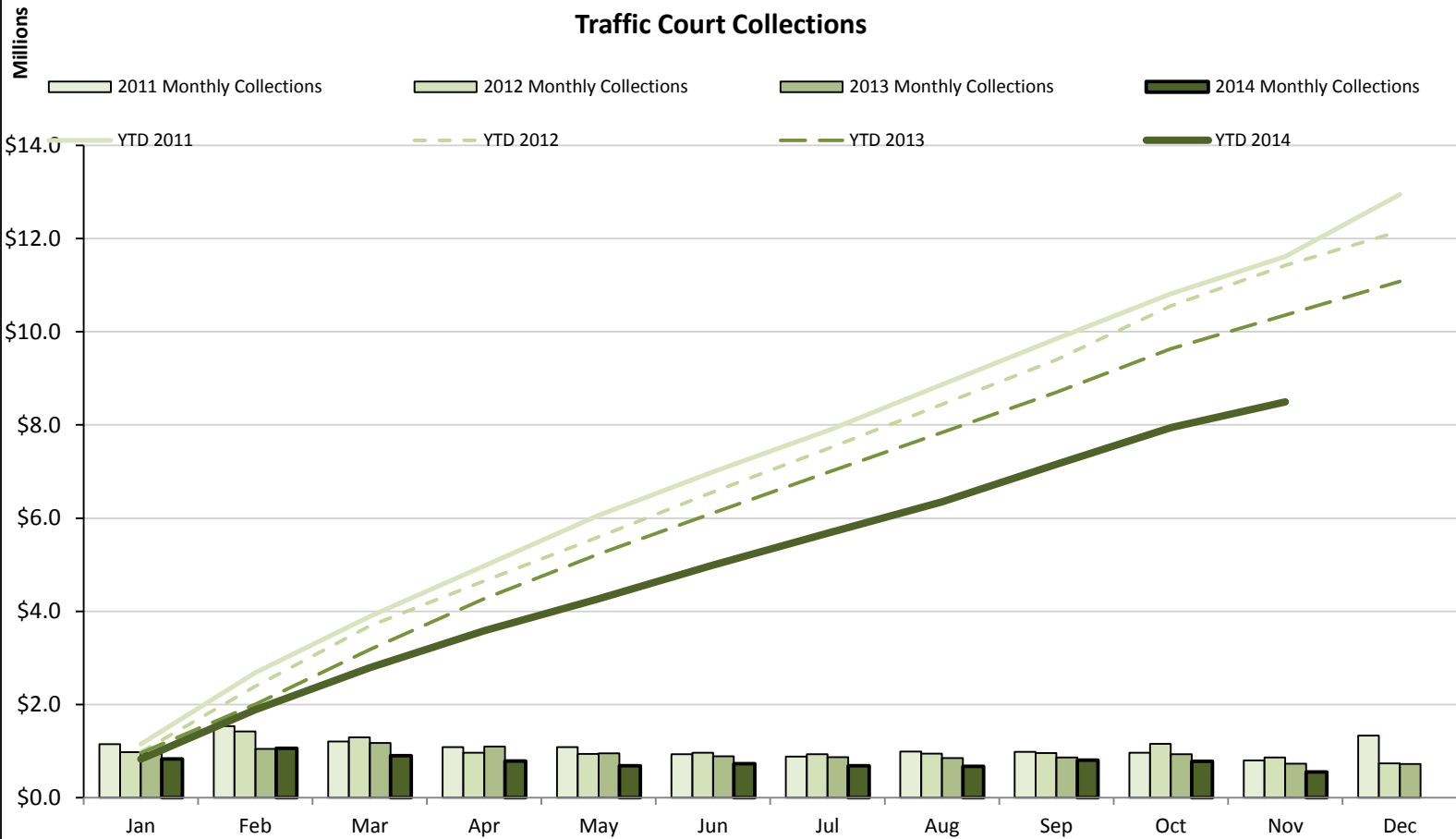

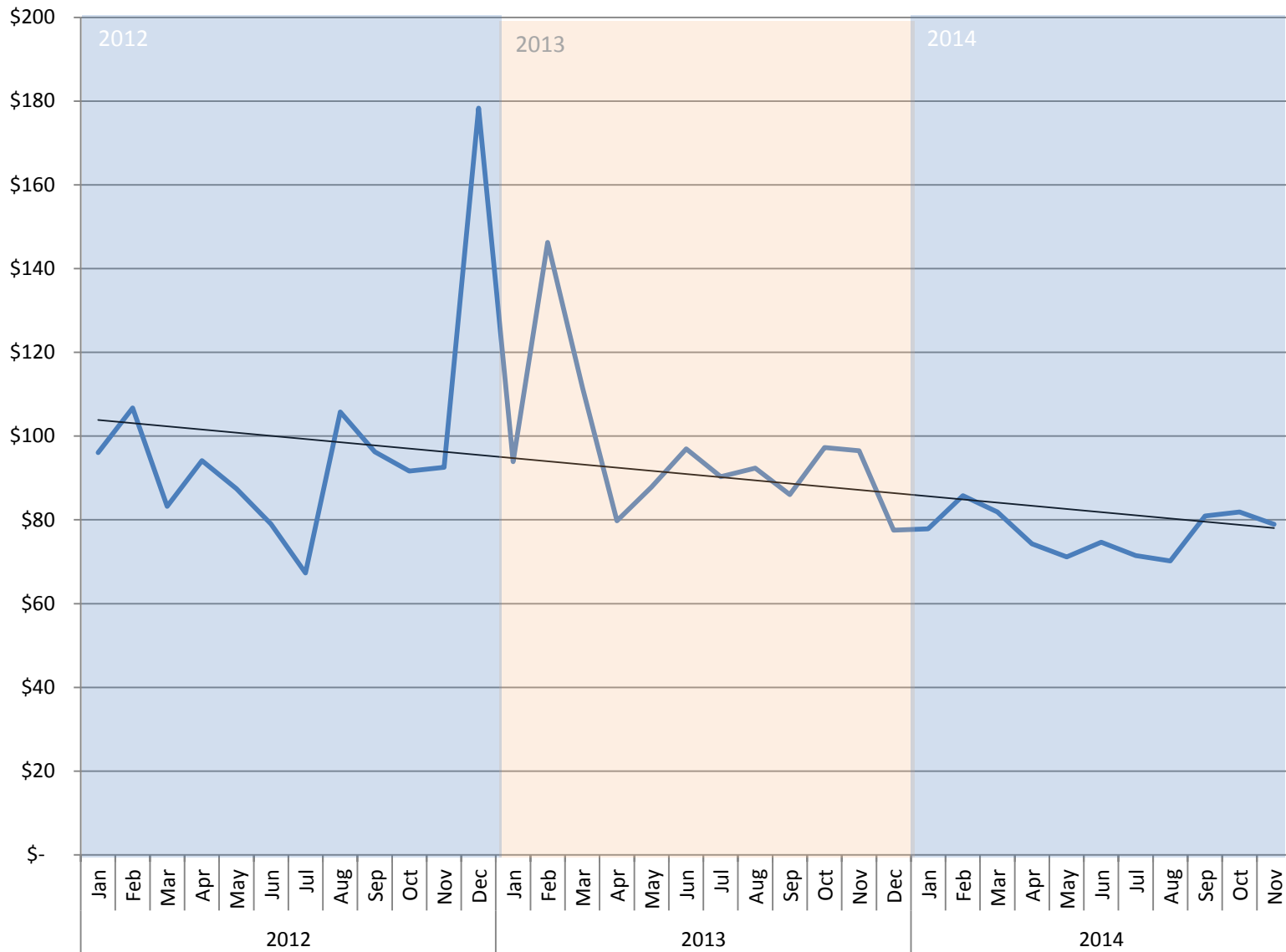

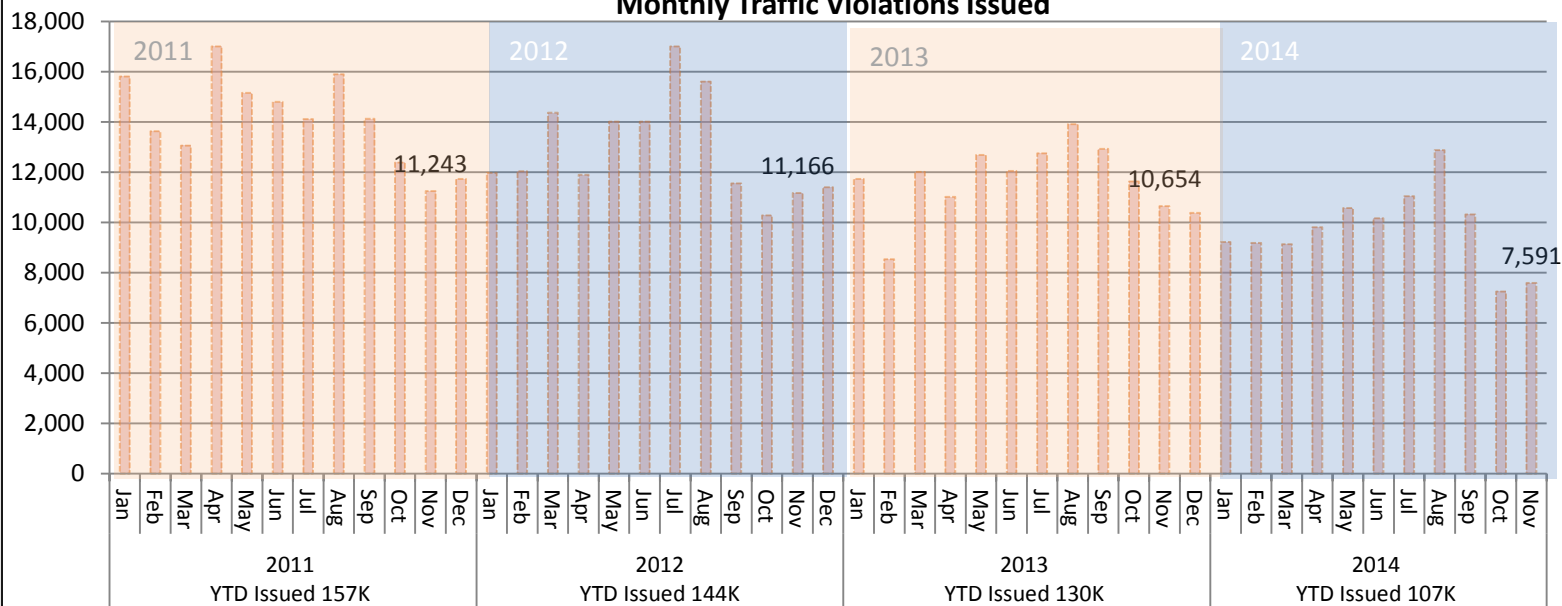

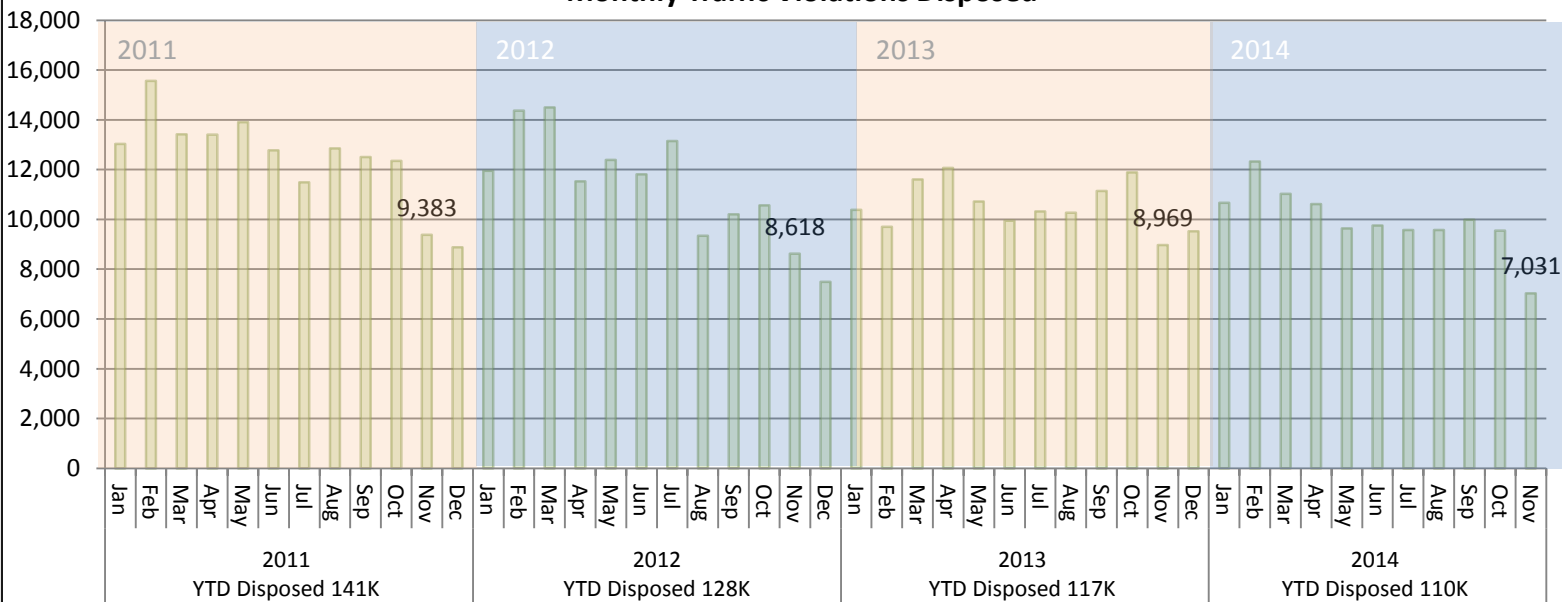

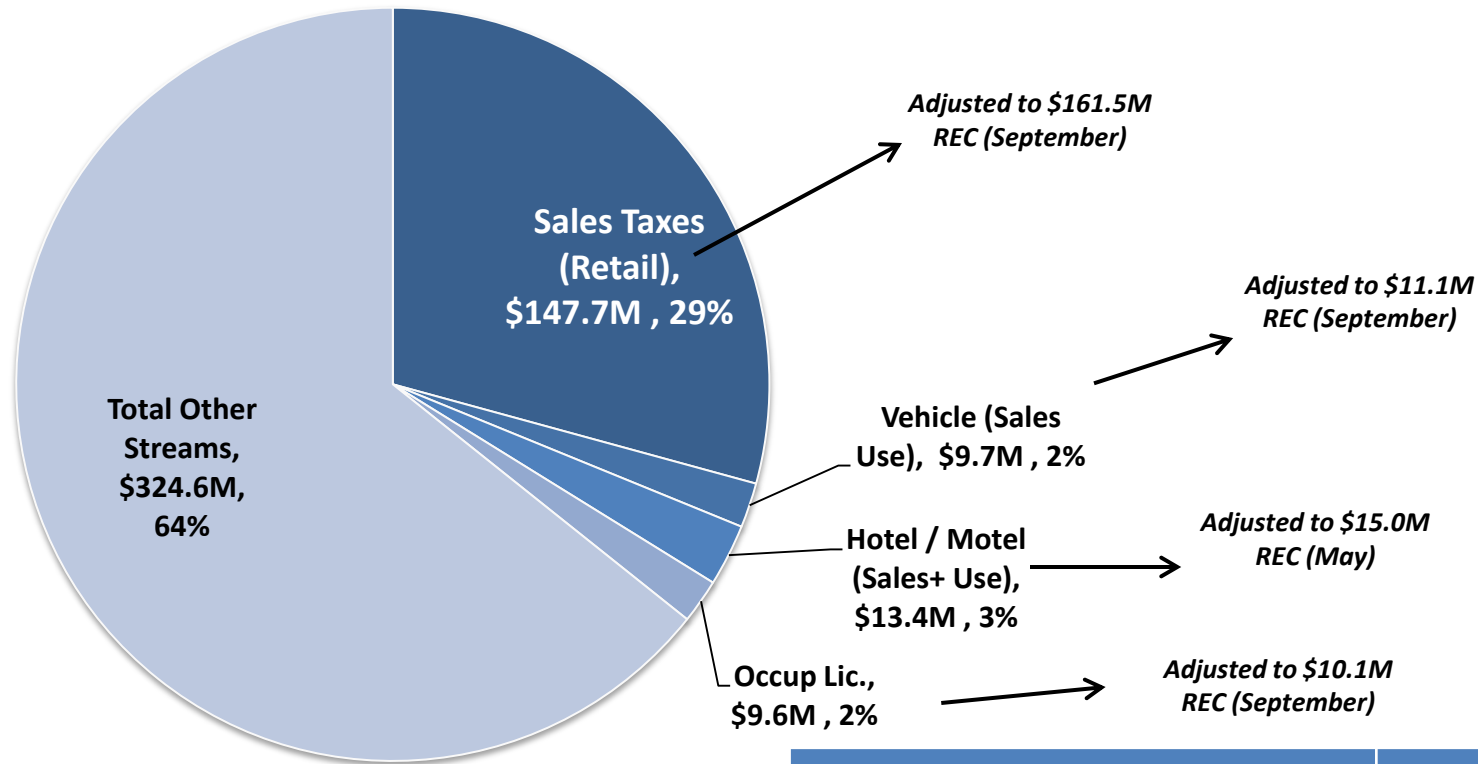

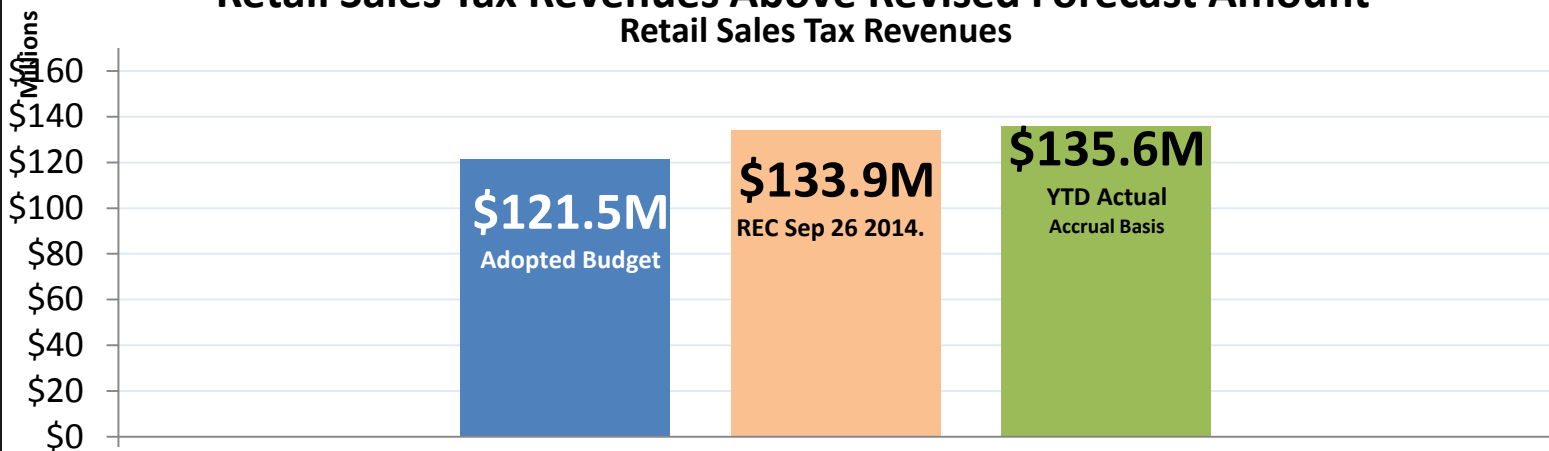

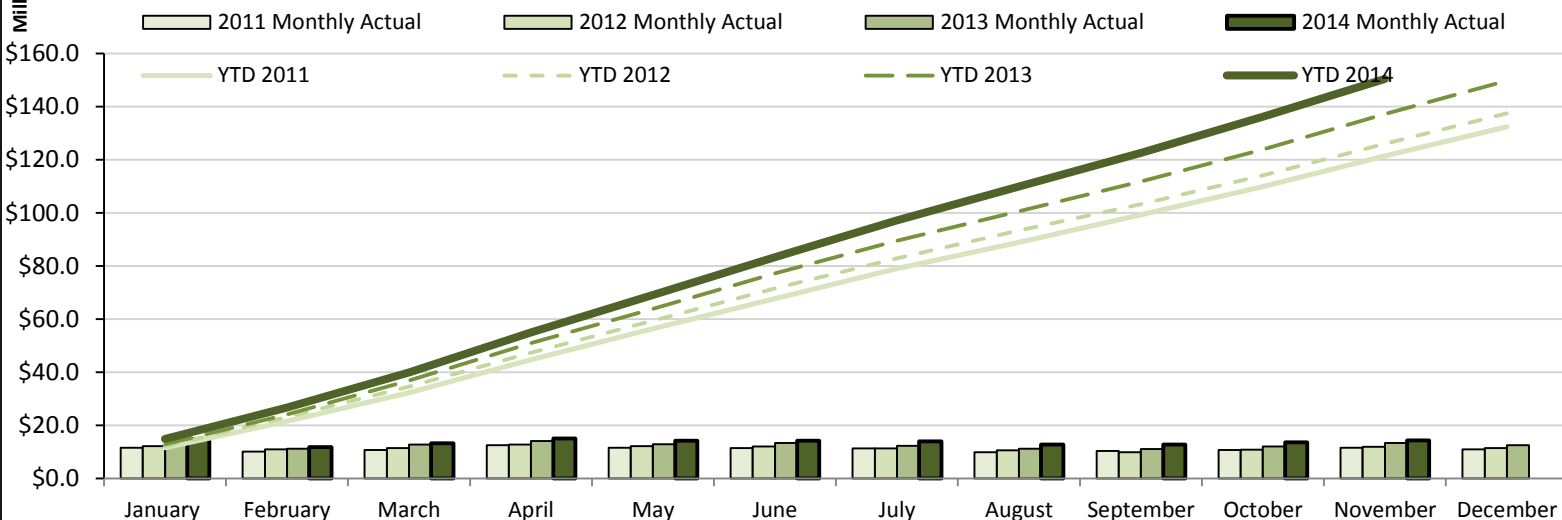

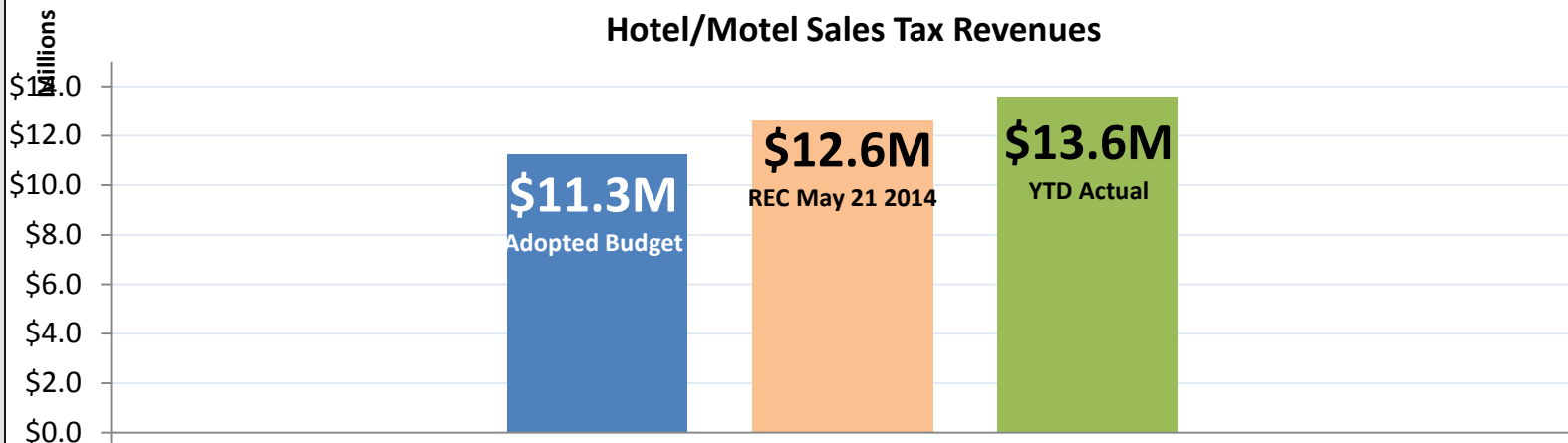

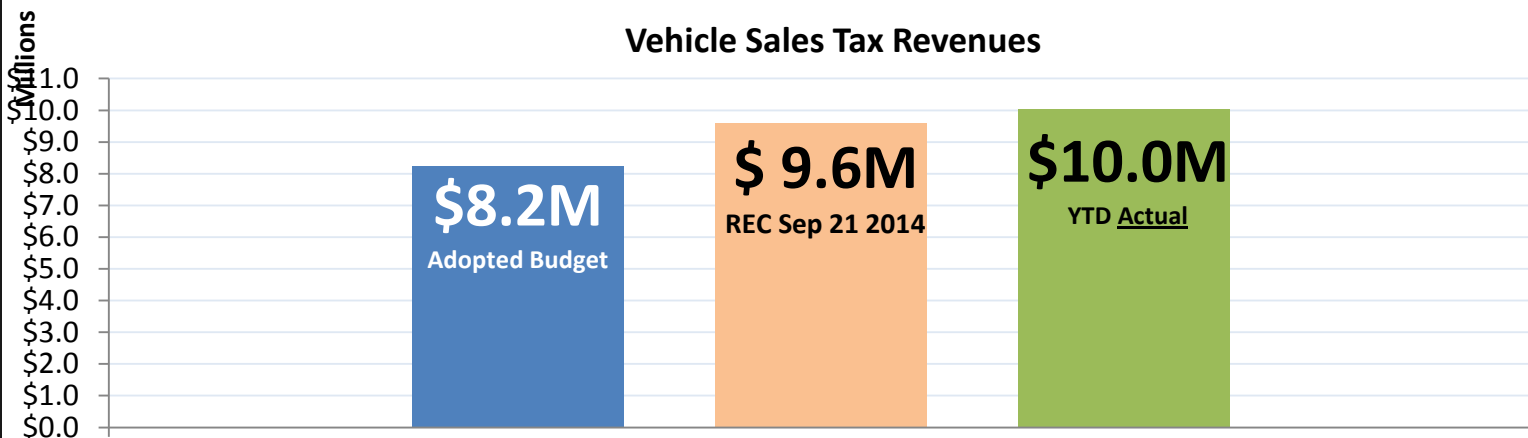

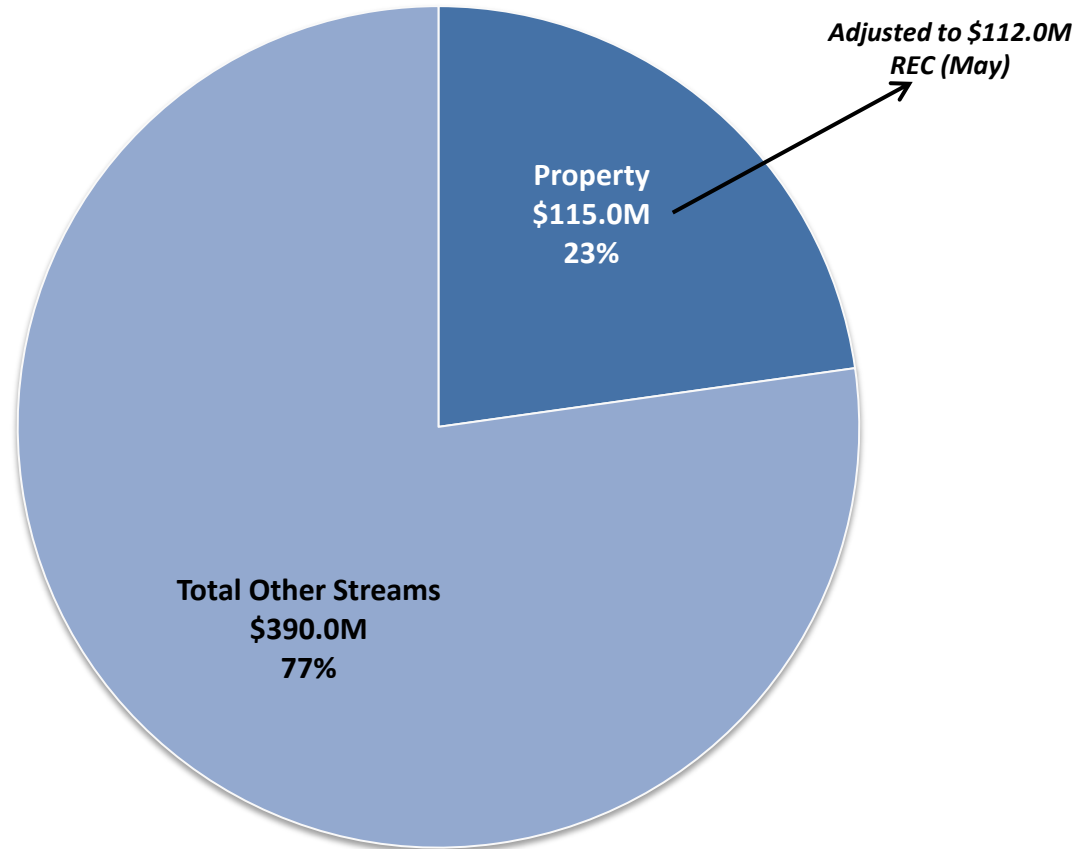

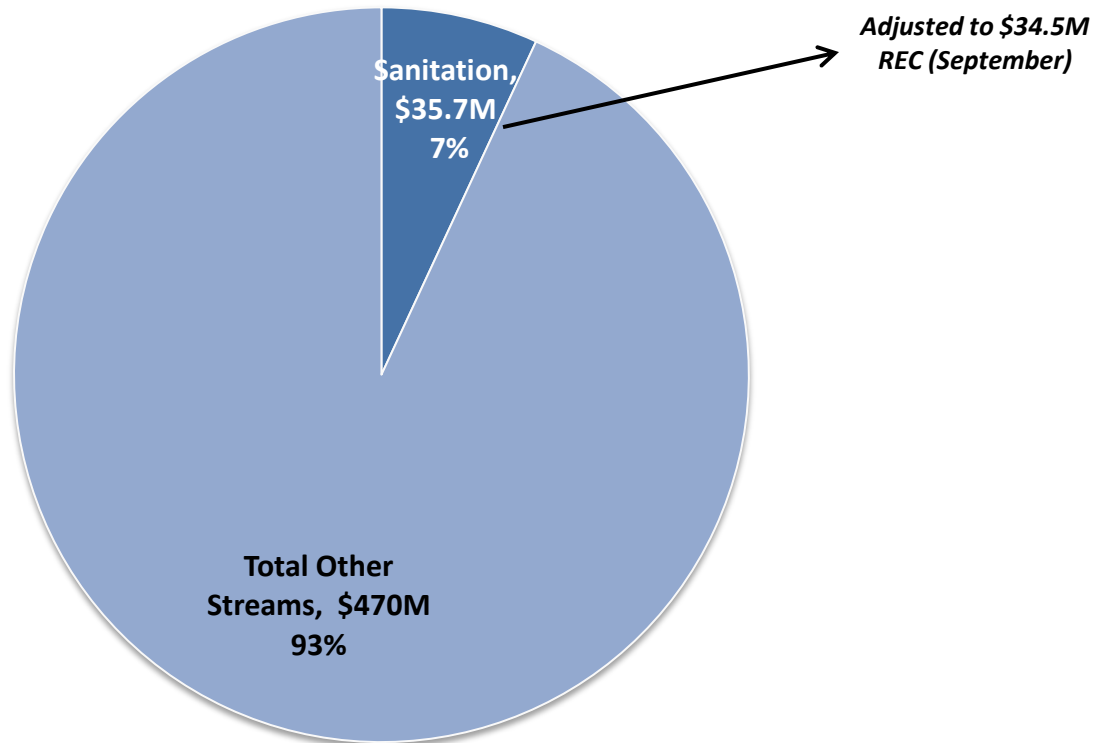

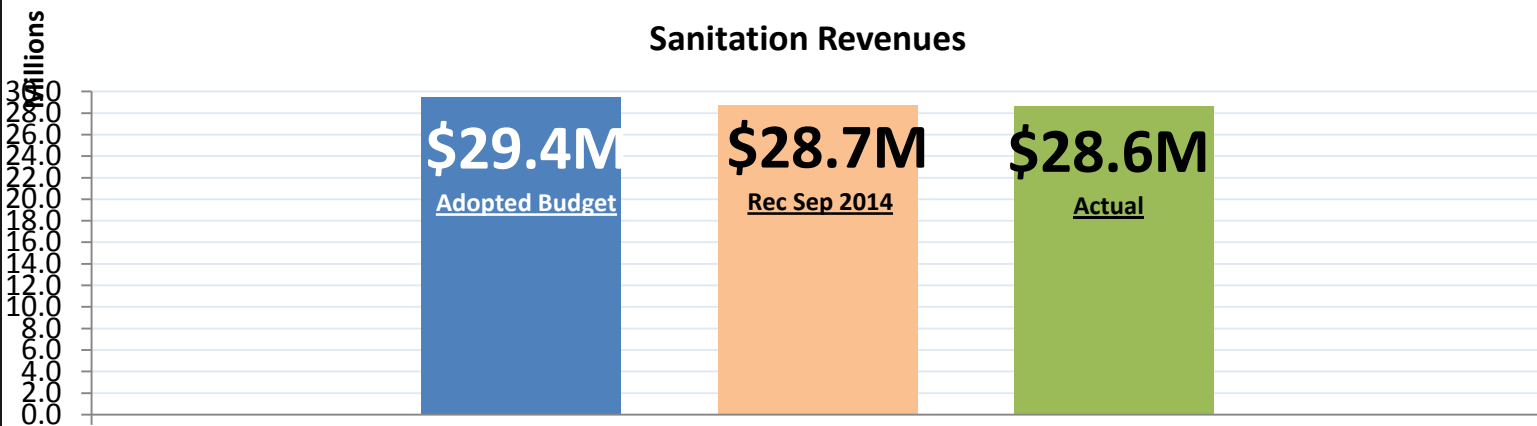

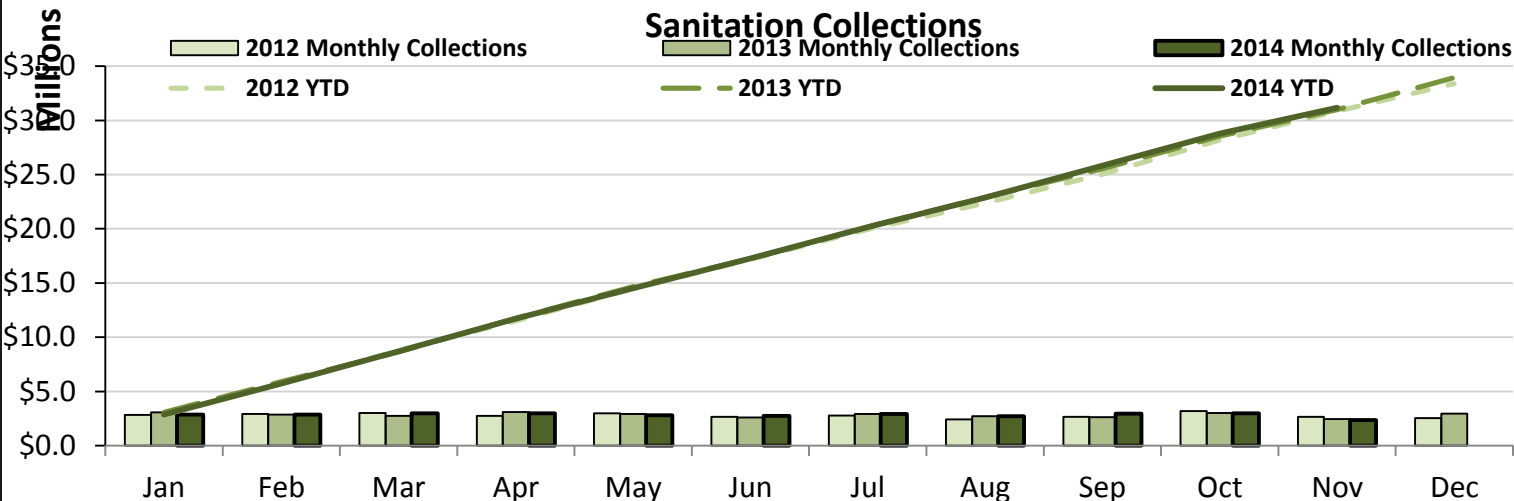

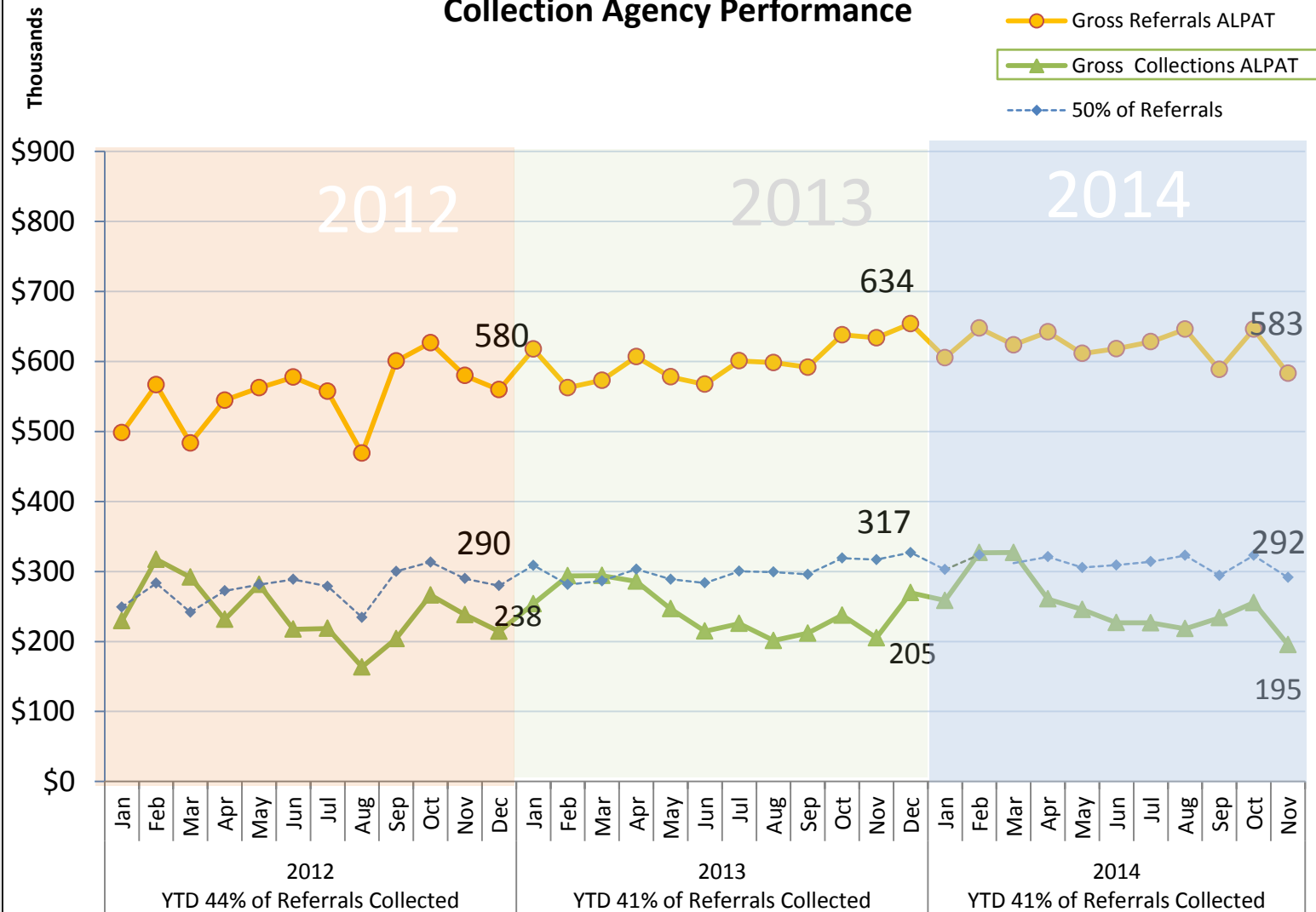

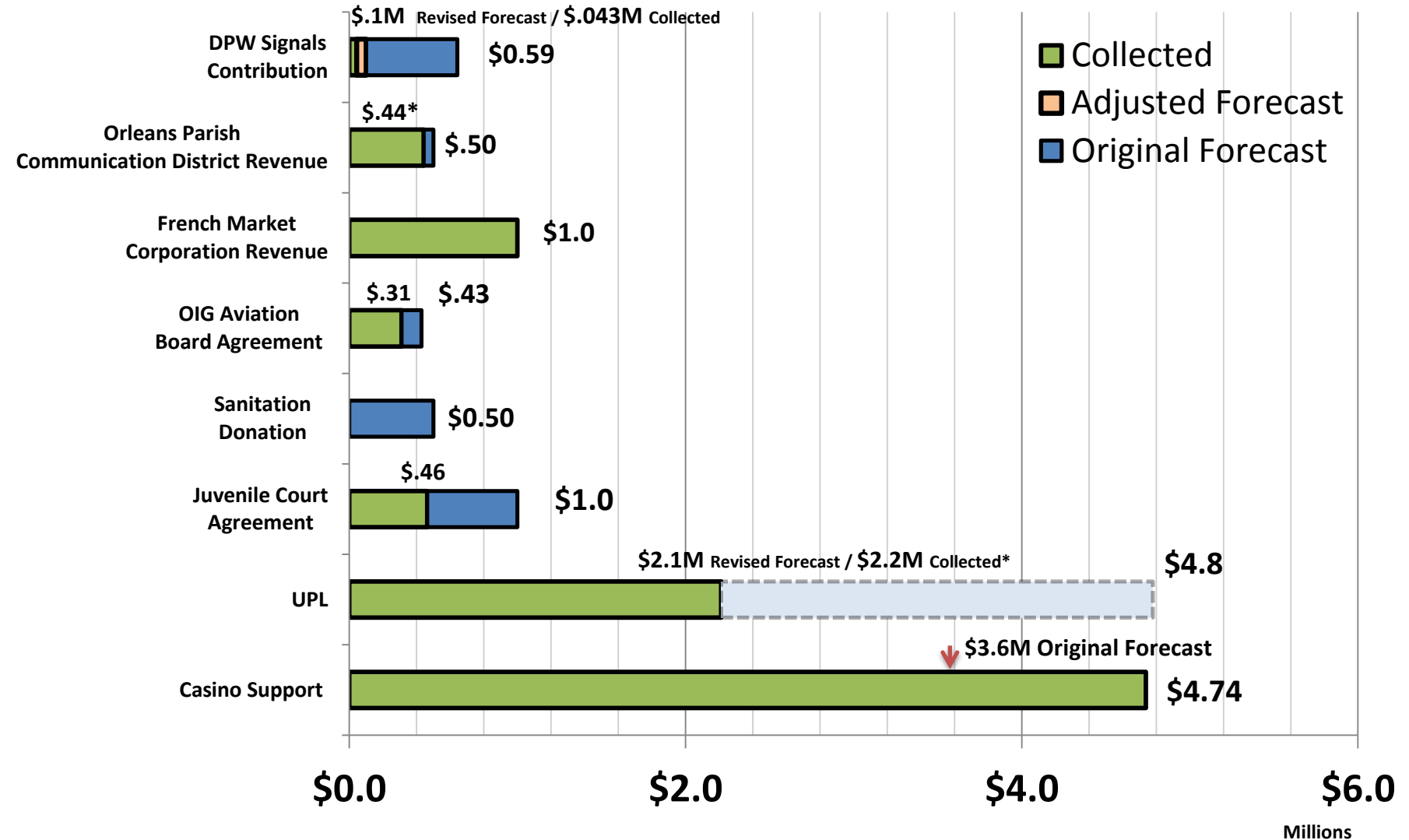

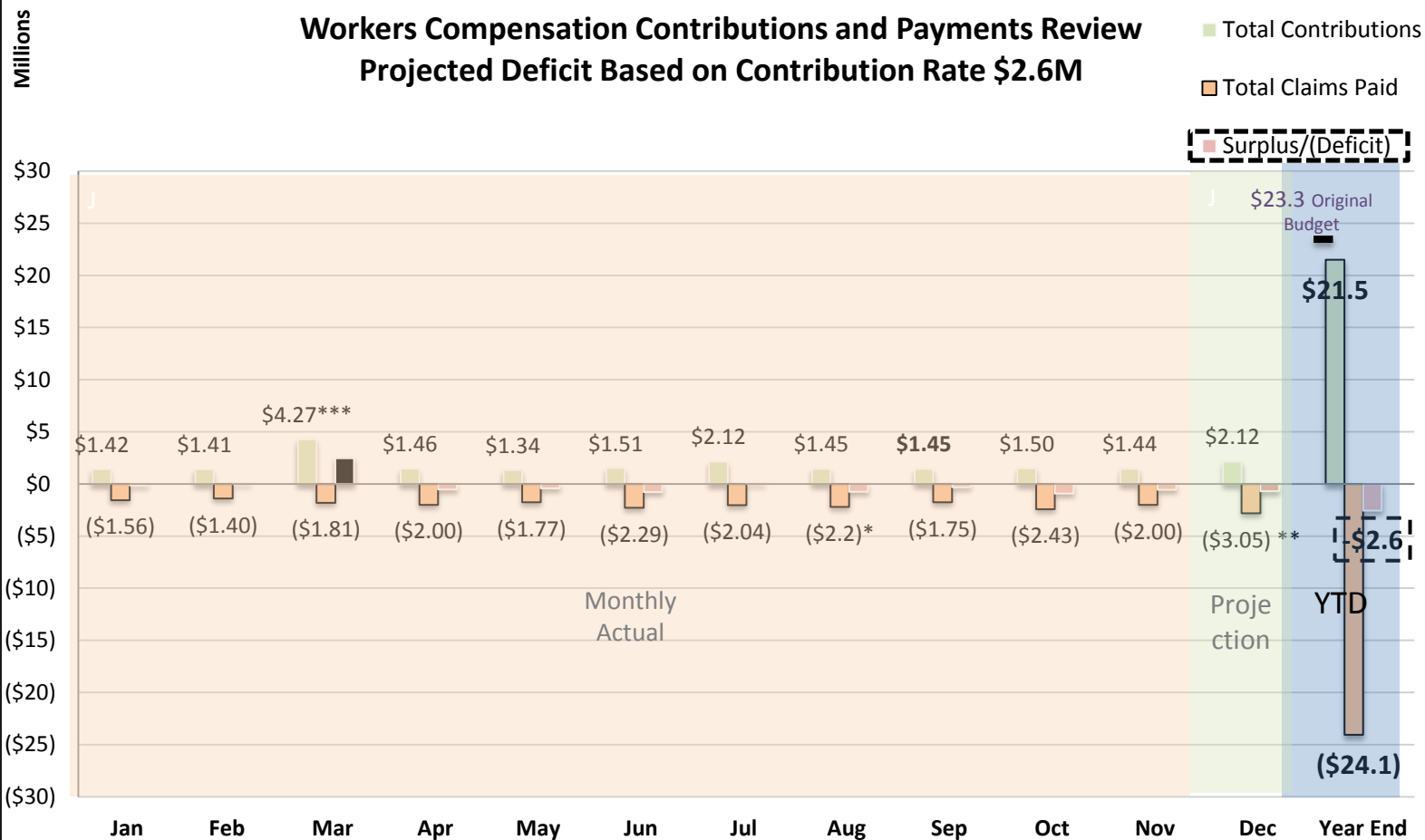

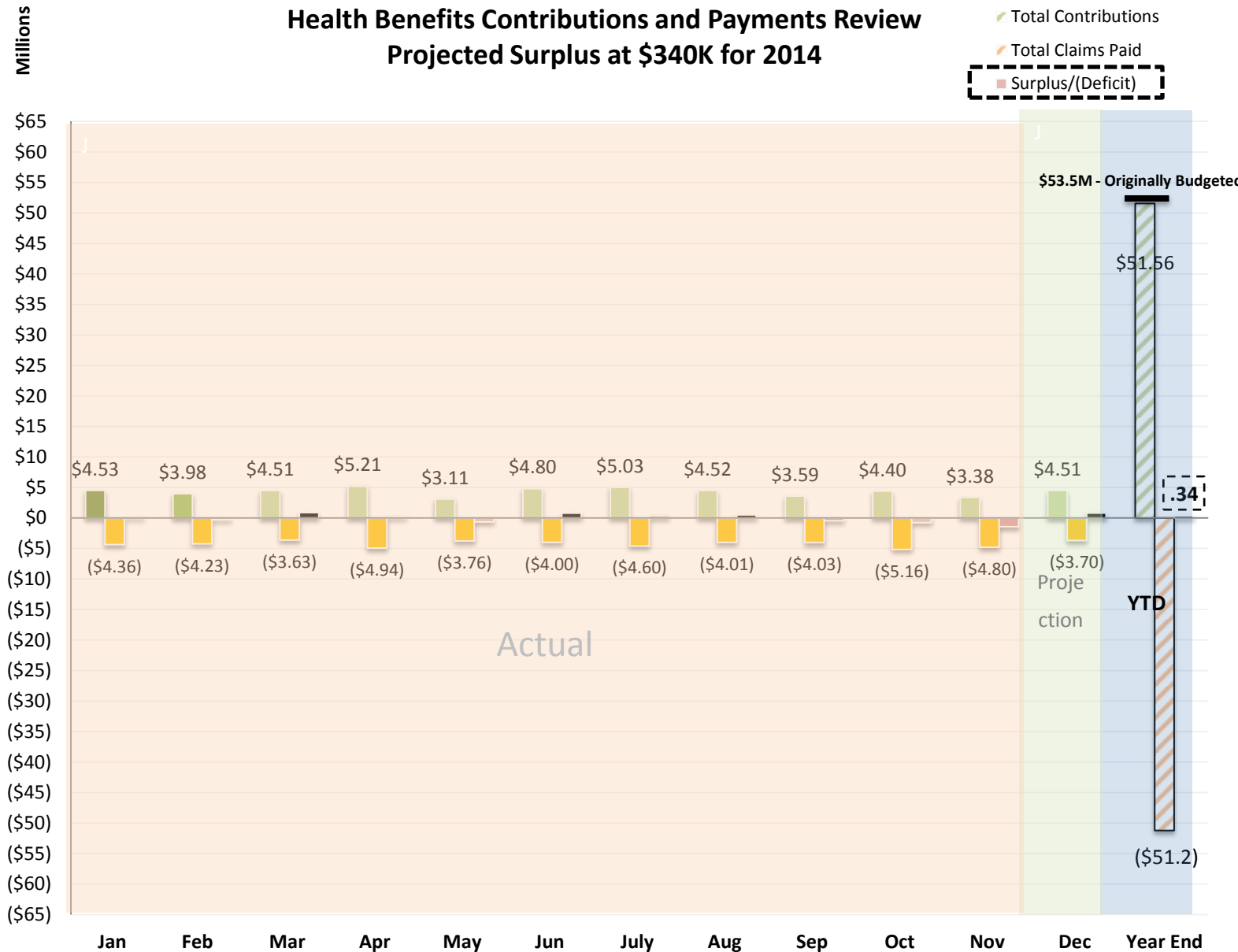

## Health Benefits Contributions and Payments Review Projected Surplus at \$340K for 2014

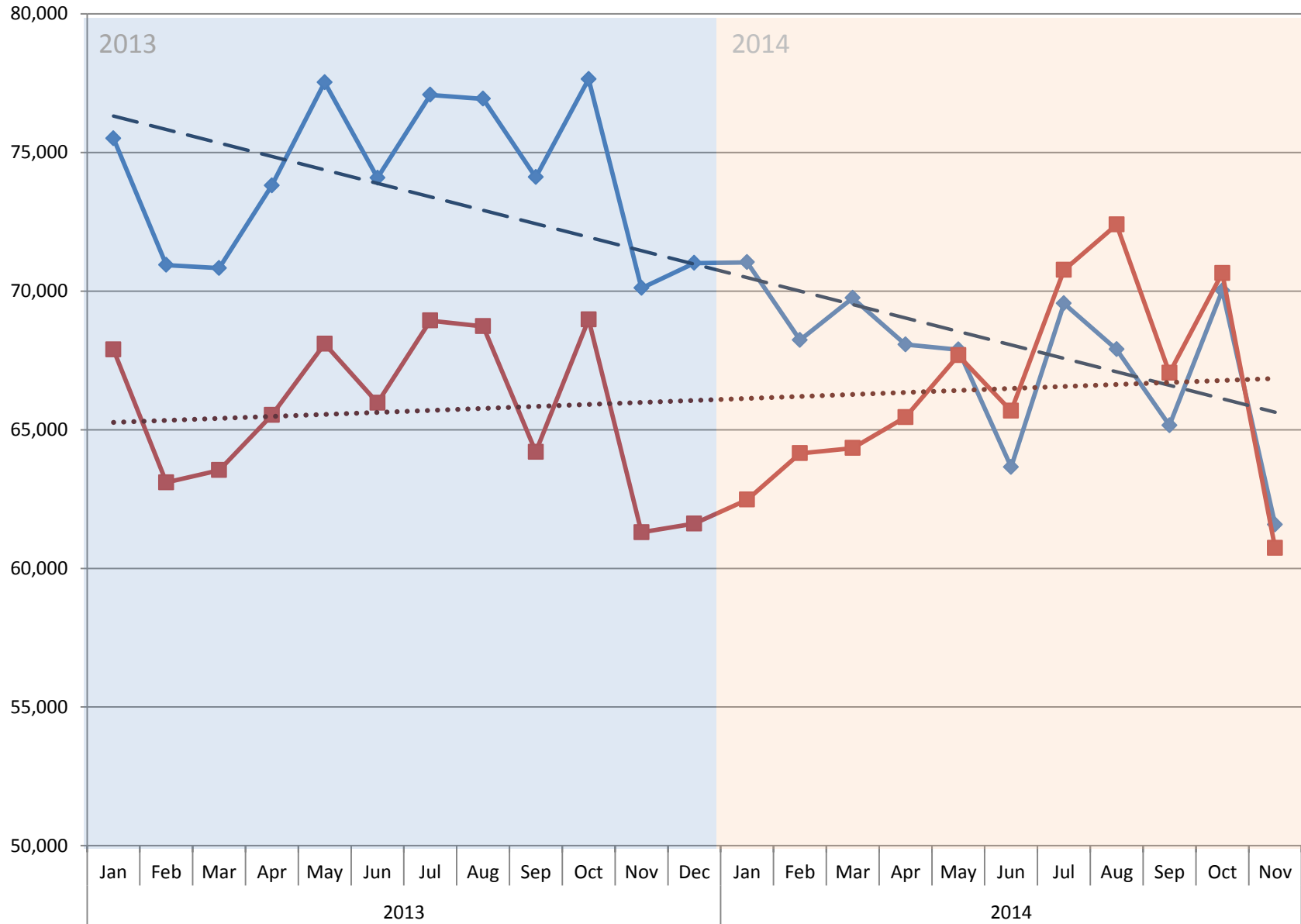

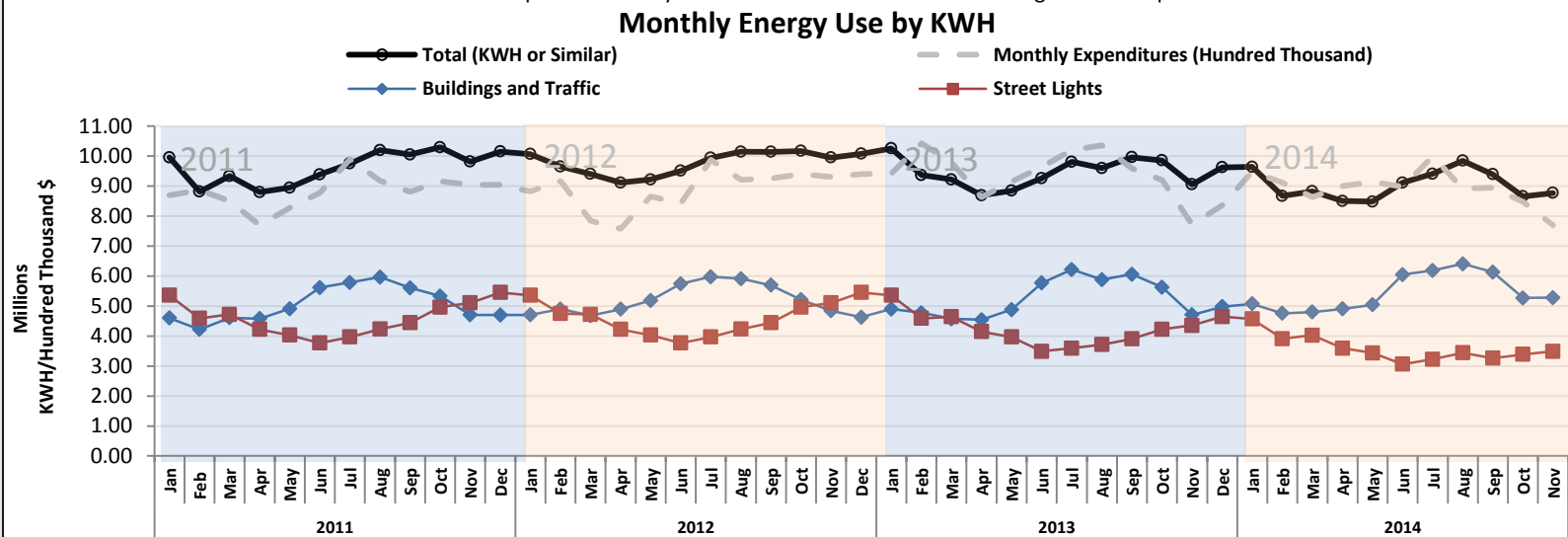
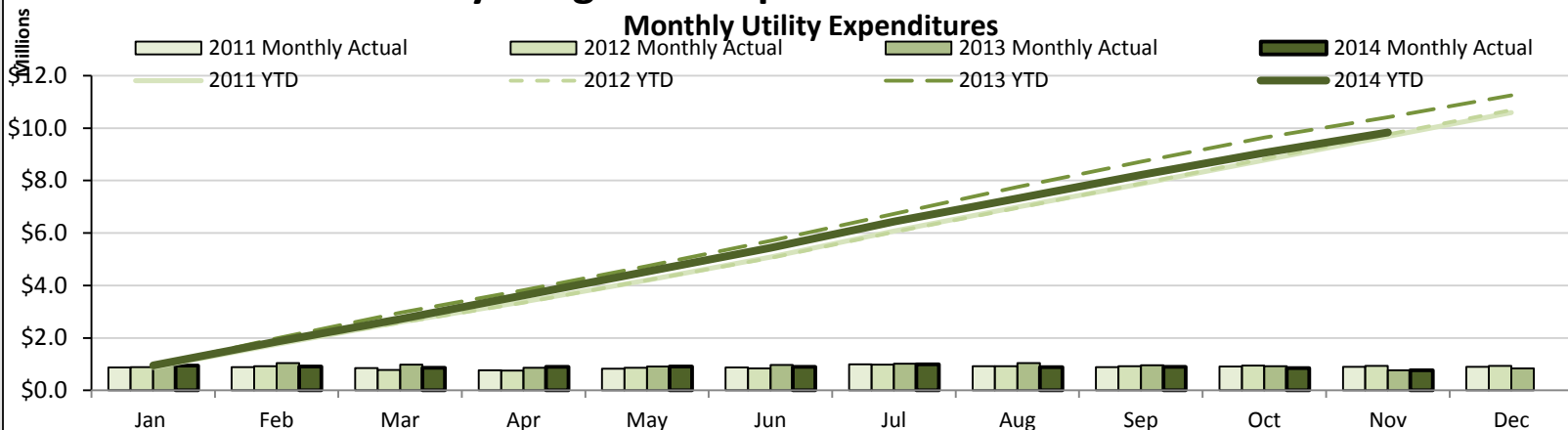
