AN ORDINANCE to ordain Article XVII of Chapter 30 of the Code of the City of New Orleans to establish regulations and requirements for operation of Residential Facilities for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities; to establish definitions, permits, requirements, fees, fines, and penalties relative thereto; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto.

WHEREAS, on August 29, 2021, on the sixteenth anniversary of Hurricane Katrina, Hurricane Ida made landfall in Louisiana as a Category 4 hurricane with 150 mile per hour winds; and

WHEREAS, at least 207,000 Entergy New Orleans ("Entergy") customers remained in the City of New Orleans during and after the storm, with no power, and expected heat indices over 105 degrees; and

WHEREAS, it was not until September 10, nine days later, when Entergy reported that it restored power to 100 percent of New Orleans customers that could safely receive it; and

WHEREAS, in the intervening days without power, many seniors and persons with disabilities were abandoned in residential facilities, namely independent living facilities, without elevators, lights, air conditioning services, or a building manager on site; and

WHEREAS, to preserve the life and safety of these residents, the City of New Orleans undertook bold action, inspecting 32 facilities and briefly shutting down nine that posed severe danger to their residents; and

WHEREAS, through these efforts, the City of New Orleans and City Council rescued nearly 600 residents from eight living facilities, and tragically discovered five people who had already perished; and

WHEREAS, as this and other rescue and recovery operations were underway, the City Council and Mayor LaToya Cantrell's administration, including the City Health Department, Department of Safety and Permits, Law Department, and other personnel were already working to strengthen the City laws governing residential facilities for seniors and persons with disabilities to guard against similar tragedies from ever reoccurring; and

WHEREAS, the City of New Orleans Health Department held a public hearing on September 28, 2021 to present its draft rules and regulations relative to such residential facilities, and is actively pursuing their adoption; and

WHEREAS, the City Council and Mayor LaToya Cantrell further collaborated on an ordinance to govern licensure and operations, and will continue to update City laws and advocate for necessary State law changes to protect vulnerable residents in the City of New Orleans; NOW THEREFORE

- 1 SECTION 1. THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW ORLEANS HEREBY
- 2 ORDAINS, That Chapter 30, Article XVII of the Code of the City of New Orleans is hereby
- 3 ordained to read as follows:
- 4 "ARTICLE XVII. RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES FOR SENIORS OR PERSONS WITH

- For the purposes of this article, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
- 8 Annual operating license shall mean the license required by the City of New Orleans to
- 9 authorize the operation of a Residential Facility for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities within
- 10 the corporate boundaries of the City of New Orleans.
- 11 Residential Facility for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities ("Residential Facility") shall
- mean any housing facility that is not licensed by the Louisiana Department of Health and meets
- one or more of the following criteria:
- 1. Six or more units of rental housing are specifically designated for persons aged 55
- years or older
- 2. Six or more units of rental housing are specifically designated for persons with
- 17 disabilities
- 3. Fifty percent or more of the rental housing units in the facility are specifically
- designated for persons receiving permanent supportive housing services, defined as
- permanent housing in which both housing assistance and supportive services are
- 21 provided in a dedicated multi-unit facility.
- 22 Residential Facilities may also include Homes for the Aged and Residential Care Facilities, as
- 23 defined by the City of New Orleans Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance.
- 24 Sec. 30-1282. License Required for Residential Facilities for Seniors or Persons with

- 1. It shall be unlawful to engage in the operation of a Residential Facility for Seniors or
- Persons with Disabilities in the City of New Orleans without having first obtained from
- the Director of the Department of Safety and Permits an annual operating license

authorizing such activity. The Director is authorized to promulgate such rules as may be 29 30 required to carry out the purpose and intent of this Article. 31 2. Licenses shall be issued on an annual basis and shall expire on March 31. Renewal shall 32 be completed prior to April 1. 33 3. Annual operating licenses are non-transferrable and may not be assigned or granted to 34 any other person or business which may occupy the premises to which a license has been 35 previously approved. 36 4. An annual operating license is a privilege, not a right, and may be revoked, suspended, or 37 not renewed based on non-compliance with the requirements of the Comprehensive 38 Zoning Ordinance or the requirements of this Article. 39 Sec. 30-1283. – Application for License. 40 1. Any person desiring to operate a Residential Facility for Seniors or Persons with 41 Disabilities shall file an annual application for license with the Department of Safety and 42 Permits. 43 2. The application shall be in a form prescribed by the Department of Safety and Permits. 44 and, together with such other information as the Department shall require, must provide: 45 a. The name and address of the applicant. If the applicant is a partnership. 46 association, or corporation, the application shall state the names and addresses of 47 all the partners or officers, as the case may be. 48 b. The name and mobile phone number of the person managing the daily operations 49 of such facility, to be known as the point of contact.

c. The location of the Residential Facility.

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- d. A census of all residents of the Residential Facility, including all household members of each unit, with each resident's primary phone number, emergency contact name, and, for those residents and household members who voluntarily report it, use of durable medical equipment (e.g., walkers, rollators, wheelchairs, and powerchairs), oxygen, and assistive technology that requires the use of electricity.
- e. An emergency operations and evacuation plan for the Residential

  Facility. This plan may rely on the assistance of City and State agencies
  and may include individual residents' personal evacuation plans,
  property specific actions, and residents' ability to opt out of City and
  State assisted plans.

## Sec. 30-1284. – Issuance of Annual Operating License.

When satisfied that the applicant for a Residential Facility for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities annual operating license has met all applicable requirements of this Article, the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, and any regulations which may be established, the Director of the Department of Safety and Permits shall approve and issue the license. Such facilities shall be required to demonstrate continued compliance with the requirements of this Article prior to the reissuance or renewal of an annual operating license.

#### Sec. 30-1285. – Inspections.

The Director of the Department of Safety and Permits may inspect any Residential Facility for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities required to have a license under this Article. The Director, or his duly authorized representatives, shall have free and full access to the grounds, premises, and building(s) used as a Residential Facility to ensure compliance with the standards

- of this Article, the Code, and the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City of New Orleans,
- and any regulations which may be established. All persons connected with any such facility as
- officers or employees charged with the management thereof shall cooperate with any inspection
- or investigation of the Director in the administration of this Article.
- 78 Sec. 30-1286. Fees.
- 79 1. Fees shall be assessed in accordance with the following fee schedule:
- a. Annual operating license application fee: \$250.00.
- b. Delinquency fee for failure to renew by April 1: \$500.00 per month.
- 82 2. All fees collected under this Article shall be deposited into the general fund of the City.
- 83 Sec. 30-1287. Minimum Standards for Residential Facilities for Seniors and Persons with
- 84 Disabilities.
- 1. All Residential Facilities for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities shall comply with the
  Life Safety Code as determined by the New Orleans Fire Department and confirmed by
  annual facility inspections.
- 2. All Residential Facilities must maintain with the Department of Safety and Permits the current point of contact for the facility and the point of contact's mobile phone number.
- All Residential Facilities must maintain with the Department of Safety and
   Permits an updated census of all residents of the Residential Facility, as
   described in Sec. 30-1283(2)(d).
- 93 Sec. 30-1288. Facilities Required to Coordinate with the City for Emergency Planning.
- 1. All Residential Facilities for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities operating in the City of New Orleans shall provide to the Department of Safety and Permits an emergency operations and evacuation plan, to be updated on an annual basis

by April 1. This plan may rely on the assistance of City and State agencies and may include individual residents' personal evacuation plans, property specific actions, and residents' ability to opt out of City and State assisted plans.

- a. The Mayor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness and the New Orleans Health Department are authorized to establish additional standards for content of the emergency operations and evacuation plan to adequately meet the needs of the population to be served by the facility.
- b. The emergency operations and evacuation plan shall be posted in a conspicuous place at the Residential Facility. In addition, a copy of the plan shall be provided to each resident of the facility.
- 2. An annual operating license shall not be issued by the Director of the Department of Safety and Permits unless an acceptable emergency operations and evacuation plan has been filed with the Department of Safety and Permits and approved by the Mayor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness.
- 3. All Residential Facilities in the City shall provide situational updates, including a full census of all residents and staff on site, at least every 24 hours to the Mayor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness, or their designee, during all declared emergencies and disasters, i.e. states of emergency that have been officially and publicly declared by the highest executive of the State and/or the City. These situational updates will be used by the City to assess the needs of and coordinate the delivery of City resources to Residential Facilities. During a declared emergency or disaster, all Residential Facilities must also comply with the following:

119	a. The point of contact must be on site at the Residential Facility and available to		
120	the City at all times, until deemed no longer necessary by the Mayor's Office of		
121	Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness. The point of contact may		
122	designate an authorized representative for a 24-hour period by providing such		
123	person's name and mobile phone number on the preceding situational update.		
124	b. The current point of contact and mobile phone number must be posted on site at		
125	the Residential Facility in a location visible to the public.		
126	c. All Residential Facilities in the City shall provide immediate notification by		
127	email or phone to the Mayor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency		
128	Preparedness or their designee, if the facility evacuates, temporarily relocates, or		
129	temporarily ceases operation.		
130	Sec. 30-1289. – Compliance with State Regulations Required.		
131	This Article shall be construed to supplement, not to supersede or replace, the laws of the		
132	State of Louisiana.		
133	Sec. 30-1290. – Compliance with Federal Regulations Required.		
134	If a Residential Facility for Seniors or Persons with Disabilities is a U.S. Department of		
135	Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") Multifamily property, it must provide annually April		
136	1 to the Department of Safety and Permits proof of compliance with the Owner/Agent		
137	Responsibilities listed in the HUD Multifamily Emergency/Disaster Guidance put forth in		
138	Chapter 38 of the HUD Multifamily Asset Guidebook.		

139	Sec. 30-1291. – Enforcement.
140	Failure of any person, business, or entity to comply with any of the provisions of this
141	Article shall be in violation of the Code and may result in suspension or revocation of license
142	and/or fines by way of adjudication in accordance with Chapter 6 of City Code."

	Should there be a conflict between this ordinance and the corresponding Regulations
146	Governing Housing Facilities for Seniors and Persons with Disabilities, this ordinance and the
147	provisions of Sec. 30-1282 et seq. shall govern.
