Snapshot

- Provide an opportunity to discuss issues within the community, and give residents the formal occasion for direct dialogue with city staff about interests and concerns.
- District-specific sites at NORD facilities accessible to public transportation.
- Visited by almost 400 residents since implementation on June 4, 2018.
- Looking forward: Community Office Hours will expand to include additional days and times.

II. Neighborhood Leaders Roundtable Snapshot

- Quarterly, interactive meeting where neighborhood leaders talk with city leadership, network across neighborhoods, and learn, discuss, and explore solutions with government officials.
- Second quarter roundtable topic: Hurricane Preparedness
 - Presenters included neighborhood leaders, nonprofit partners and city departments.
- Resident Participation: 130 resident leaders
- Resident Reach: 155,000 Residents
- Looking Forward: Next Roundtable on Sept. 22nd

- Attended, coordinated or presented at 165 community meetings.
- 18,176 Neighborhood Engagement Office posts have been shared by residents online.
- Communicated with over 200 neighborhoods through various outreach strategies.

IV. Police Community Advisory Board (PCAB) Snapshot

- The framework for a public participation plan with the NOPD to engage in a collaborative problem-solving process that supports both the community and the police desire to enhance public safety.
- Open enrollment started on July 30th.
- 80+ applications received to date.
- Looking forward: Training new board members per police district.
